



Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

1 November 2011

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- The Israeli Occupation Army arrested the Palestinian legislator Hassan Yousef and his son Aws at his house in Betunia city in Ramallah Governorate.
- The Israeli Occupation Army stationed at the gate of Sal'it settlement and prevented Palestinian farmers from Kafr Jammal south of Tulkarm from accessing the gate to their agricultural lands segregated west of the segregation wall to harvest their olive trees.

- The Israeli occupation Army raided Qabatiya town south of Jenin city, arrested Yazan Al Shaib (23 years old) from Jenin city and Mohammad Tariq Yusuf Abu Al Rab (21 years old) from Jalbun village.
- Israeli occupation Army arrested seven Palestinian residents from At Tur neighborhood in Jerusalem city allegedly for throwing Molotov bombs and stones at the police and Beit Orot religious school in the Jabal Al Zaytoun (Mount of Olives).

Expansion of Settlements

- The Israeli Prime Minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, and his forum of eight senior ministers decided to accelerate settlement building in the West Bank and withhold the Palestine funds in response to a UNESCO decision to admit Palestine as a member. The plan is to move ahead with the construction of 2000 housing units in East Jerusalem, most specifically in Gush Etzion and Ma'ale Adumim settlement blocs.
