Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt 1 April 2012

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- The Israeli Occupation Army fired against a number of Palestinian children in Al Faraheen area east of Khan Younis. The children demonstrated near the eastern borders of Gaza city marking Land Day. No injuries were reported. Wafa (April 1, 2012).
- The Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) raided the house of Murad Shtewi, coordinator of peaceful marches in Kafr Qaddum village east of Qalqilyah and chased his children under the pretext of throwing stones

- at Israeli soldiers during the peaceful marches that are held every week in the village. Wafa (April 1, 2012).
- Tens of Palestinians were injured as the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) suppressed the weekly peaceful demonstration held in Beit Ummer town north of Hebron city. Among the injured people, the following were known: Younis Musa 'Arrar, Ahmad Khalil Abu Hashem, Saqer Sadeq Abu Maria and a number of International activities. Wafa (April 1, 2012).
- the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) hindered Palestinian citizens from reaching their lands in Al Kotla Hamlet (Khallet Al Kotla) near Karmei Tzur settlement south of Beit Ummer town and arrested resident Hussein Ramzi Khader 'Allamah (14 years) and took him to unknown destination. Wafa (April 1, 2012)
- The Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) set up a sudden checkpoint at Beit Kahel's village entrance north of Hebron city, detained Palestinians and checked in their ID cards. ARN (April 1, 2012)

Israeli Arrests

- The Israeli occupation Army (IOA) detained a number of Palestinians in Al Rahma Mountain near Ramat Yeshai in Hebron city, beat them and checked their ID cards. Wafa (April 1, 2012).
- The Israeli Reconciliation Court in West Jerusalem extended the detention of 30 Palestinians from Jerusalem city who were arrested during the demonstrations that took place in Jerusalem marking Land Day. The extension period ranged between 2 and 4 days. Wafa (April 1, 2012)
- The Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) gave three residents from Maythalon village south of Jenin city notifications to interview the Israeli Intelligence Police in Salem Detention center after raiding their families' houses and messing with their contents. The notified Palestinians are: Anees Jameel Abu Zenah (22 years), Mustafa Nayef Rabay'a (25 years) and Ibrahim Abd Rabay'a (18 years). Wafa (April 1, 2012).
- The Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested resident Samer Madi Zama'rah from Halhul city and took him to unknown destination. ARN (April 1, 2012)
- The Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) detained 120 young Palestinians in the old city of Hebron for than hour and a half. ARN (April 1, 2012).
- The Israeli Occupation Army arrested eight people who took part in the re-opening of an abandoned house and threatened of seizure by the Israeli occupation authorities in Hebron old city. It is worth mentioning that five Palestinians and three international activists were

arrested for re-opening a house that was closed upon an order issued by the Israeli Occupation authorities some years ago and is owned by the Hebron's Women Society. Among the arrestees, Issa Amro, Tamer and Imad al-Atrash were known. ARN (April 1, 2012)
