

Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

2 December 2011

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Israeli Occupation Army suppressed the weekly peaceful demonstration organized by the local Popular Committee against the wall and settlements in Ni'lin village in Ramallah governorate. The IO troops used tear gas bombs, rubber bullets and bomb sounds where dozens of Palestinian residents along with International activists were injured.
- 5 Palestinians were injured as the Israeli Occupation Army suppressed the peaceful demonstration that took place in Bil'in village, where the IOA used tear gas and rubber bullets, and sprayed dozens of

Palestinian residents along with International activists by waste water mixed with chemicals.

- The Israeli Occupation Army raided Um Al Rukba area south of Al Khader village in Bethlehem city, stormed the house of Yousef Hassan Da'dou', searched it, and arrested his son Mohamad (21 years old). Additionally, the IOA raided a number of Palestinian houses and searched them in the village.
- The Israeli Occupation Amy closed the western entrance of An Nabi Salih village northwest of Ramallah city, prevented resident from entering and exiting the checkpoint and checked their ID cards.
- Israeli Occupation Army attacked the weekly peaceful demonstration that took place Al Ma'sara village, which came in solidarity with the prisoner Ra'ed Aamour, who is suffering a difficult health situation in the Israeli prison. The IO troops used tear gas bombs, rubber bullets and sound bombs causing the injury of Ra'fat 'Ala Ad Deen and Ali Zawahra.
- The Israeli Occupation Army renewed for the second time the administrative detention of Wasfi Ezat Qebha (52 years old) from Jenin city.
- A number of Palestinian citizens were injured as the Israeli Occupation Army suppressed the peaceful demonstration that took place in Kafr Qaddum village in Qalqilyah Governorate.
- The Israeli occupation Army arrested 3 Palestinian citizens from Balata refugee camp east of Nablus city after storming their houses. The three Palestinians are Yasser Al Badrasawy, Jamil Al Badrasawy and Haytham Al Badrasawy and took them to unknown destination.
- The Israeli Occupation Army prevented around 30 Palestinian farmers from 'Anin village west of Jenin from entering their lands.
- The Israeli Occupation Army prevented Palestinian farmers from working in their lands in Susyia area east of Yatta town in Hebron Governorate. The IOA declared 2000 dunums of lands owned by Abu Subha family as closed military area.

The city of Jerusalem began works two weeks ago on a road that will connect the capital's northeastern neighborhoods to Jerusalem's main traffic artery, Menachem Begin Boulevard, as part of a policy to strengthen bonds between neighborhoods across the Green Line and the rest of the city. The settlments to be connected by the new route are Pisgat Ze'ev, Neve Yaakov, Anatot, Shoafat, and Beit Hanina; the route 20 project will also link Jerusalem's northern neighborhoods with route 443, which in some places crosses through the West Bank. Jerusalem's municipality, along with the Moriah Jerusalem Development Company, is advancing the project with an investment of over NIS 150 million. Work is expected to go on for 14 months. The next stages will see the completion of a bridge over route 50, with another bridge to be constructed over Nahal Atarot due east. Route 20 will be extended to link the latter to Beit Hanina intersection.
