Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

11 February 2012

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Two Palestinians were wounded in an explosion that took place in Beit Lahia in the northern part of the Gaza Strip. The two were moved to Kamal Odwan Hospital in Beit Lahia suffering moderate wounds. Eyewitnesses reported that the explosion took place while Israeli drones were heard flying over the area.
- The Israeli occupation Army raided Deir Abu Da'ef village east Jenin city under the intensive fire and sound bombs, causing clashes

between the Army and the residents but no injuries and arrests were reported. In addition, the IOA raided Jalqamous village and patrolled its army vehicles the streets.

Others

- Al-Aqsa foundation for Waqf and Heritage stated that the Israeli district committee for planning and building approved the plan number(11053) to build a huge building called" Beit Haliba" in Al Buraq wall area near Bab Al Magharba bridge in Jerusalem city. The building area is 3700 square meters, of 3 stories and other 2 floors under ground. The building will be ready for settlers use who visit the wailing wall in addition to the tourists, the building will includes reception, and information center.
- The Ministerial Committee on Legislation will discuss a bill recognizing donations to "Zionist settlement" for tax purposes. The bill would confer a tax exemption of up to thirty-five percent on such donations. The bill did not specify whether "Zionist settlement" referred to settlement in the West Bank or anywhere in Israel, although in practice it most likely means giving assistance to organizations that promote settlement beyond the Green Line. The bill's sponsors, Likud MKs Zeev Elkin and Zion Pinyan, seek to add "strengthening Zionism and encouraging Zionist settlement" to the list.
