Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

13 January 2012

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

 The Israeli Occupation Army raided An Nabi Salih village northwest of Ramallah city, conducted raid and search operations in a number of Palestinian houses, arrested citizens and closed all entrance leading to the village and turned it to military zone.

- The Israeli Occupation Army suppressed the weekly peaceful demonstration against the wall and settlements that took place in Al Masa'ra village in Bethlehem city.
- A number of Palestinian citizens along with International activists
 were injured as the Israeli Occupation Army suppressed the peaceful
 demonstration that took place in Bil'in village west of Ramallah
 Governorate. The IOA used tear gas bombs and rubber bullets and
 sprayed dozens of activists by wastewater mixed with chemicals.
- The Israeli Occupation Army suppressed the weekly peaceful demonstration against the wall and settlements that took place in Kafr Qaddum village in Qalqilyah Governorate. The IOA used tear gas bombs and rubber bullets and caused the injury of a number of Palestinian citizens along with International activists in the demonstration. Israeli occupation troops also occupied the roof of Adnan Abd Al-Mahdi's house, detained his family in one room and prevented them from using communication devices.
- A number of Palestinian citizens were injured as the Israeli Occupation Army shelled at a residential area in Al-Bureij refuge camp in Gaza strip.
- The Israeli soldiers arrested 2 Palestinian citizens in Hebron city and took them to unknown destination after being attacked and beat by Israeli settlers in Al-Shuhada street in Hebron city.
- Israeli settlers attacked a number of Palestinian citizens in Silwan town south of Jerusalem city; The Israeli occupation troops also arrested Abed Sarhan Al-Qmeri (18 years old), Fu'ad Al-Qaddi (20 years old), Abd Qa'qur (19 years old) and Abd Atieh (20 years old).

Uprooting & Destruction of fruit trees

 Israeli settlers of Kafr Tapuah settlement uprooted and destroyed about 100 olive trees in Al-Mafqa'a area northwest of Yasuf village in Salfit city. The uprooted trees are owned by residents of Yasuf and Jama'een villages.
