Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

5 March 2012

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- The Israeli Occupation Army arrested 16 Palestinian citizens after raiding Ramallah, Qalqilyah, Nablus and Bethlehem governorates.
- The Israeli Occupation Army arrested 5 Palestinian children from Silwan town in Jerusalem city; the arrestees are: Shadad Al-'Awar (12 years old), Souhaib Al-'Awar (13 years old), Eilas Al-'Awar (14 years old), Ahmad Salah (14 years old) and Islam Al-'Awar (17 years old).

- The Israeli Occupation Army raided Al 'Arrub refugee camp and arrested 5 Palestinian citizens; Samer Abdulla Al-Hur (27 years old), Mos'ab Mohamad Ismail Al-Hur (20 years old), Nihad Abd Al-Nabi Ayoub (24 years old), Shadi Ahmad Abas Abu Raiya (22 years old) and Adham Mohmad 'Awdi (21 years old), searched their houses and messed with their contents. In addition to that, the IOA searched a number of Palestinian houses and set up military checkpoints at the entrances of the town.
- Palestinian citizen Muhammad Taysir Abu Awad (19 years old) was injured as result of clashes broke between the Israeli Army and Palestinians at 'Atara military checkpoint north of Ramallah city.'
- The Israeli Army detained 2 Palestinian families from Qalqilyah city while they were visiting their relatives in Ramon prison in Israel. The detainees are: Diala Mohammad Mustafa Mattar (26 years old) and her brother Saad (14 years old) while visiting their father, Muhammad Mattar. The IOA also arrested Yusra Adel Qe'dan (29 years old) while visiting her brother Sa'ed.
- The Israeli Occupation Army raided a number of Palestinian houses and handed out 3 citizens from Misliya village in Jenin city notifications to interview the Israeli intelligence in Salim military base west of the city. The notified residents are: Iyad Tareq Abu Na'im (22 yaers old), Amin Ezat Abu Al-Rab (23 years old) and Diya' Fawaz Abu Al-Rab (12 years old). The IOA also raided a chicken farm owned by Abd 'Amir Hanyasha.

Others

- An Israeli news site revealed that the Israeli Occupation Army is seeking to issue a license for establishing 'A Security Wall" near the bypass road in Beit Ummar town north of Hebron city to protect the Israeli settlers from stone throwing. The settlers use the bypass road connecting between the Gush Etzion settlement block and Qiryat Arba' settlement in Hebron which witnesses intensive stone throwing.
- The Committee against the wall and settlements in Jerusalem revealed that a plan is being prepared by the Israeli Municipality of Jerusalem to take over the Islamic museum near Bab Al Magharba and turn it into a synagogue.

• The Palestinian National Authority has set a number of conditions for the resumption of peace talks with Israel. The conditions reportedly include the acceptance by Israel of a two-state solution based on the 1967 borders, with the possibility of a limited land swap, and a complete halt of settlement construction, including in East Jerusalem. The conditions are also said to include the release of Palestinian prisoners held in Israeli jails. The conditions will be delivered to Israel by Jordan after they are reviewed by the United States.
