Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt 06 April 2015

he daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats the occupied Palestinian territory, in the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Clashes erupted between Palestinians and the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) in Salfit city. The IOA fired teargas and stun grenades at Palestinians. (Maannews 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) stormed and searched dozens of Palestinian houses in Surif village, northwest of Hebron city. The targeted houses are owned by Al-Hour and Ghnemat families. (Raya 6 April 2015)

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) and bulldozers staged 200 meters into the eastern parts of Al-Fakhari and Khaza'a villages, east of Khan Younis city, south of Gaza strip, and razed lands. (RB2000 & Al- Quds 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation gunboats opened fire at Palestinian fishing boats while they were sailing at As-Sudaniya shore, northwest of Gaza strip. (Al-Quds 6 April 2015)

Israeli Arrests

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Mohammad Sharef Shaheen (20 years) after storming and searching his family house in Hebron city. (ARN 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested three Palestinians and summoned Mohammad Ismail Za'oul and his son Azz Ad Diyn (12 years) to interview the Israeli Intelligence Police after storming their houses in Husan village, west of Bethlehem city. (Maannews & Pal Today 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested a Palestinian from Farkha village, northwest of Ramallah city. (Maannews 6 March 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested two Palestinians after storming and searching their houses in Silat Al-Harithiya village, northwest of Jenin city. The arrestees were identified as: Ragheb Abed Al Men'em Ash-Shalabe (30 years) and Ibrahim Kamel Ash-Shalabe (38 years). (Panorama FM 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Mohammad Yassen (31 years) after raiding his house in 'Anin village in Jenin governorate. (Panorama FM 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Thair Sufiyan Ar-Rayashi (20 years) after storming his family house in Azzun village, east of Qalqiliyah city. (Wafa 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) summoned Ahmed Kamel Thawabta (26 years) to interview the Israeli Intelligence Police in Gush Etzion settlement bloc, after raiding his house in Beit Fajjar village, south of Bethlehem city. (Pal Today 6 April 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Iyad Jawad Barqan (14 years) from Jerusalem city. (Al-Quds 6 April 2015)

Israeli Settler Violence

• Israeli settlers escorted by the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) stormed Al-Aqsa mosque in Jerusalem city and toured in its courtyard. (Al-Quds 6 April 2015)

Erection of Israeli checkpoints

• Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) erected military checkpoints at the northern and western entrances of Hebron city and at the main entrance of Sair town. The IOA stopped and searched Palestinian vehicles and checked ID cards. (Raya 6 April 2015)

Israeli Closures

• Israeli Occupation Authorities decided to close a number of main streets in the old city of Jerusalem, to allow Israeli settlers to celebrate "Passover" holiday. (ARN 6 April 2015)
