Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

01 November 2015

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

The daily report does not necessarily reflect ARIJ's opinion.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) prevented the Palestinian teachers and students from leaving their School; Kurtuba School, which located at Ash-Shuhada street in the central of Hebron city. The IOA claimed that the teachers and the student do not have the permit to enter or leave the school. (Pal Info 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) stopped and questioned a number of Palestinians at Dotan military checkpoint near the entrance of Yabad town, west of Jenin city. (Safa 1 November 2015)

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) stormed Al Issawiya town in Jerusalem city and fired rubber bullets at Palestinian houses. As a result, Mazen Ahmed Abu Al Humos (42 years) was injured in his face while he was in front of his house. (SilwanIC 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) attacked the celebration of the freedom of Ala Sarhan Al Qamari (22 years) in Beir Ayoun neighborhood in Silwan town in Jerusalem city. The IOA fired stun grenades at Palestinians and arrested Qauis Al Qamari. (SilwanIC 1 November 2015)
- Clashes erupted between Palestinians and the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) in Abu Dis town, east of Jerusalem city. The IOA fired rubber bullets, causing the injury of a Palestinian. (Pal Today 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) detained a Palestinian ambulance while it was transferred a Palestinian from Ash-Shuyyukh medical central to a hospital in the central of Hebron city. (Pal Today 1 November 2015)
- Clashes erupted between Palestinians and the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) in Al Khader village, southwest of Bethlehem city. The IOA fired rubber bullets, teargas and stun grenades at Palestinians, causing tens of suffocation cases. During the clashes, the IOA fired metal bullets at garbage truck. (Wafa & RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Clashes erupted between Palestinians and the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) at the northern entrance of Bethlehem city. The IOA fired teargas grenades and rubber bullets, causing dozens of suffocation cases and the injury of two Palestinians. (RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) invaded and searched a Palestinian house in Beit Fajjar village, south of Bethlehem city. The targeted house owned by the family of the Palestinian Martyr "Ramadan Mohammad Thawabta (8 months)". (RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) invaded Al Fawar refugee camp, south of Hebron city, after clashes erupted between Palestinians and the IOA, where the IOA used live bullets to attack Palestinians. (RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) stormed and searched several areas in Ayda refugee camp, north of Bethlehem city. (RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) launched a blimp in Hebron city. (NBPES 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) shoot and killed Fadi Hassn Faroukh (29 years) while he was at the entrance of Beit Einun village, north of Hebron city. (Al-Quds 1 November 2015)
- Clashes erupted between Palestinians and the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) in Khirbet Al Tuqu in Tuqu village, southeast of Bethlehem city.

The IOA used rubber bullets and teargas grenades to attack Palestinians. (Al-Quds 1 November 2015)

- Three Palestinians were injured and dozens suffered gas inhalation during clashes that erupted between Palestinians and the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) in Sair town in Hebron governorate. The IOA used live bullets and teargas grenades to attack Palestinians. Noted that after the clashes, the IOA closed all the entrances of the town and prevented Palestinians from entering or leaving the town. The IOA also, stormed and searched houses and the medical center. (Al-Quds & RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Two Palestinians were injured after the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) opened fire at a number of Palestinians while they were near the border fence, east of Al Burij refugee camp in the central of Gaza strip. (Maannews 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) invaded At-Tur town in Jerusalem city, and fired stun grenades at Palestinians and their houses, causing the injury of a Palestinian. During the operation, the IOA arrested Yousif Abu Al Hawa. (SilwanIC 1 November 2015)

Israeli Arrests

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Azz Ad-Diyen Za'oul (10 years) and his Father Mohammad Za'oul after raiding their house in Husan village, west of Bethlehem city. The IOA transferred the arrestees to unknown location. (Al-Quds 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested 8 Palestinians after storming and searching their houses in Sur Baher town, south of Jerusalem city. The arrestees were identified as: Mohammad Jadalla (16 years), Yassen Al Atrash (17 years), Muhssen Atwan (17 years), Abdalla Abu Kaf, Mohammad Bkirat (18 years), Mahir Atwan (18 years), Ahmed Jadalla (18 years) and Na'il Rabay'a (21 years). (SilwanIC 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested two Palestinian children while they were in front of their houses in Shufat town, north of Jerusalem city. The arrestees were identified as: Yousif Hassan Abu Khdair (7 years) and Omar Mohammad Abu Khdair (8 years). (SilwanIC 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Shadi Abdalla from As-Sawana neighborhood in Jerusalem city. (SilwanIC 1 October 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested two Palestinians from Qalqiliyah city. The arrestees were identified as: Mohammad Ash-Shubaki (14 years) and Shawqi Yaneen (39 years). (Wafa 1 November 2015)

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Mohammad Hazem Asakrah (15 years) from Bethlehem city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested four Palestinians after stopping them at Za'tara military checkpoint, south of Nablus city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Hussien Abu Ridah (10 years) and his son Tareq (22 years) after raiding their houses in Qusra village, south of Nablus city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Muaz Abu Sheikha and his brother Yousif after storming their house in Karma village, southwest of Hebron city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Muaz Taisir Nawa'ja from Yatta town, south of Hebron city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Sohaib Abu Warda after raiding his house in Al Fawar refugee camp, south of Hebron city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Ali Mohammad Hassan Rashiyda after storming and searching his house in Ar-Rashayida village, southeast of Bethlehem city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) summoned Khalid Ahmed Salem (36 years) to interview the Israeli Intelligence Police in Gush Etzion settlement bloc, after raiding his house in Al Khader village, southwest of Bethlehem city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) summoned Mahir Ali Radaida (30 years) and Munir Mohammad Shaniytah (26 years) to interview the Israeli Intelligence Police in Gush Etzion settlement bloc, after raiding their houses in Al Ubidiya town, east of Bethlehem city. (Wafa 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested four Palestinians after storming and searching their houses in Beit Ummer town, north of Hebron city. The arrestees were identified as: Yahya Ahmed Hassan Sabarnah (25 years), Ibrahim Khalil Mahmoud Abu Daya (25 years), Malek Bassem Mahmoud At-Titi (16 years) and Sohaib Khalid Abed Al Hamied Sabarnah (17 years). The IOA transferred the arrestees to unknown location. (RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) arrested Ameer Jamal Yousif Jaradat (25 years) from Silat Al Harithiya village in Jenin governorate, after raiding his house in Al Bireh city. (RB2000 1 November 2015)

Israeli Settler Violence

- Israeli settlers destroyed the fence surrounded Palestinian land in An-Nabi Samwil village, north of Jerusalem city. The targeted land is owned by Eid Barakat. (RB2000 1 November 2015)
- Israeli settlers escorted by the Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) stormed Al Aqsa mosque in Jerusalem city and toured in its courtyard. (NBPRS 1 November 2015)
- Ala Hassan Al Khateb (25 years) was injured after an Israeli settler hit him by his vehicle at the main road near Azzun village, east of Qalqilyah city. (Al-Quds 1 November 2015)
- An Israeli settlers living in Karmi Zur settlement stormed two Palestinian houses at Wadi Ash-Sheikh area in Beit Ummer town, north of Hebron city, and threatened the residents. The targeted houses are owned by Amer and Azay Khalil Saber Sabarnah. (Maannews 1 November 2015)

Israeli Military Orders

- Israeli Occupation Authorities decided to confiscate 102 dunums of Palestinian lands in the cities of Bethlehem, Beit Sahour and Beit Jala. According to the Israeli resources, the Israeli Authorities will confiscate 4 dunums of land near the Giloo 3000 military checkpoint, 70 dunums of land from Jabal Abu Ghneim area in Beit Sahour town, and 28 dunums of land in Beit Jala town. (Al-Quds 1 November 2015)

Other

- Israel: New diplomats will be trained to defend settlements. Israeli soldiers shot dead a knife-wielding Palestinian who tried to stab them on Sunday in the West Bank city of Hebron, the military said, in the latest violence of a bloody six-week spell. The military said the shooting took place during a riot and that no Israelis were harmed. Later Sunday, a Palestinian rammed his car into a group of Israelis standing on the side of the road in the West Bank, police spokeswoman Luba Samri said. She said the attacker escaped and security forces were searching the area. Three people were hurt, one seriously, said Eli Bin of Israel's rescue service. A series of Palestinian attacks began in mid-September over tensions surrounding a sensitive Jerusalem holy site and have since spread across Israel, the West Bank and Gaza. It has been accompanied by widespread unrest, including clashes between Palestinian stone-throwers and Israeli troops. Israel has blamed the Palestinian attacks on what it says is anti-Israel incitement by

Palestinian political and religious leaders. Palestinians say the violence is largely driven by the hopelessness many Palestinians feel after nearly half a century of Israeli military rule, with no end in sight. In recent days, Hebron has become a flashpoint of Israeli-Palestinian violence, with near-daily deadly confrontations at Israeli checkpoints that guard ultra-nationalist Jewish settlers in the center of the city. In these incidents, Palestinians have been shot dead after the military said they stabbed or tried to stab soldiers. Hebron has been divided since the late 1990s, as part of what was meant to be an interim agreement ahead of a final peace deal that never materialized. Israel controls the city center, where 850 Jewish settlers live, while the remaining areas of the city are under Palestinian self-rule. Also Sunday, Israel's deputy foreign minister said diplomats in training will now visit the West Bank and be taught how to defend the status of Jewish settlements there. Tzipi Hotovely told Israel's Army Radio that she initiated changes in the course curriculum to include a greater emphasis on the Jewish people's ancient links to the land. "There are systematic Palestinian attempts to rewrite history and cut the deep ties between the Jewish people and its historic capital," she said. She said the course will include compulsory tours to the City of David, a Jewish enclave in mostly Arab east Jerusalem, seized by Israel in the 1967 war from Jordan and claimed by the Palestinians as part of their future state. Hotovely says it is important to stress that Jewish settlements are legal "by law and custom." The international community generally considers settlement in lands captured in the 1967 war to be illegal and illegitimate. With Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu also serving as foreign minister, Hotovely oversees the office's day-to-day operations. ([Business Insider](#) 1 November 2015)
