Israeli Violations' Activities in the oPt

29 June 2017

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Israeli occupation Army (IOA) raided the village of Bilin west of Ramallah city which erupted into clashes. The IOA injured two Palestinian youths with rubber-coated steel bullets, while others suffered tear gas inhalation. However, no detentions were reported in the village. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- A blacksmith workshop in the Jerusalem-area town of Abu Dis in the West Bank was raided and sealed for allegedly manufacturing weapons.

- In the southern West Bank, Israeli occupation Army shot and killed 23-year-old Iyad Munir Arafat Ghaith during a raid in Hebron city. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- An Israeli-operated unmanned aerial vehicle, or drone, fell from the sky in the Bethlehem area of the southern occupied West Bank. The drone had fallen near Bethlehem, and that Israeli occupation Army (IOA) had retrieved it. Drones are a typical sight in the occupied West Bank, as the IOA use the technology to surveil the Palestinian territory for various reasons, including during Palestinian protests. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- Israeli occupation Army (IOA) escorted by army rabbis into the village of Beit Ummar in the West Bank Governorate of Hebron before dawn and broke into the village's main mosque, which hosts the tomb of Nabi Matta, also known as Matthew's Tomb. Two rabbis performed prayers inside the tomb, photographed the mosque and took measurements of tombs inside the house of worship for more than three hours. Meanwhile, soldiers raided several old homes in Beit Ummar, and fired a tear gas canister at a house belonging to Omar Ahmad Awwad, igniting a fire in an old washing machine placed just outside the house. After the fire erupted, clashes broke out between the IOA and Palestinian youth. The IOA fired rubber-coated steel bullets at the Palestinians, hitting 15-year-old Malik Ayish Abu Hashem and fracturing his arm, Awwad said, adding that dozens more suffered from tear gas inhalation. The IOA also detained Muhammad Khalil Abd al-Fattah Sabarneh, 32, Shihada Yousif Shihada Adi, 30, and Moussa Khalid Ayyad Awwad, 17, during the clashes, and transferred them to the Etzion military base north of Beit Ummar. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- An Israeli army raid in the Ramallah-area village of Bilin led to clashes, in which two Palestinians were injured. The two Palestinian youths were hit by rubber-coated steel bullets. The injured Palestinians were identified as 15-year-old Iyad Birnat, who was reportedly hit in the chest and hand, and 18-year-old Hamza al-Khatib, who was hit in the thigh. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- Israeli police restricted entry of Muslim worshippers into Al-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem's Old City while it allowed Jewish settlers accompanied by chief of police in Jerusalem to continue with their provocative tours of the Muslim holy compound. The police first held identity cards of Palestinians entering the compound before it closed it completely to Muslim worshippers less than 40 years of age as the chief of police Yoram Levi toured the mosque with a group of Jewish

settlers. The police ended its closure of the mosque following the departure of the police chief and settlers. (Maannews 29 June 2017)

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) raided Qabatyia town south of Jenin city, and detained citizen Suleiman Abu Ar Rob after searching his house under the pretext that his son is wanted by the Israeli Intelligence Police. (Wafa 29 June 2017)

Israeli Arrests

- Israeli occupation Army (IOA) detained a Palestinian in the southern occupied West Bank city of Hebron for allegedly being in possession of a knife. The man, is said to be in his thirties. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- Israeli soldiers raided the Ramallah-area village of Deir Abu Mishal and arrested Hasan Ankoush, father of Martyr Adel Ankoush who was killed by the Israeli Police in Jerusalem three weeks ago. The army also raided the Atta family residence and ransacked their homes before leaving the village with Hasan Ankoush. (Wafa 29 June 2017)
- Israeli occupation Army (IOA) detained 38-year-old Ahmad Ali Issa from Marqa village in the Jenin Governorate. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- Israeli occupation Army (IOA) detained Nidal Sufian Zarab, 21, from the Qalqiliya Governorate. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- In the village of Deir Abu Mashaal in the Ramallah Governorate, Israeli occupation Army (IOA) detained Hassan Ankoush, the father of slain Palestinian Adel Ankoush, who was shot dead by the IOA earlier this month. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) detained two Palestinians in the village of Qibya in the Ramallah Governorate. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) detained a Palestinian in the village of Deir Ammar in the Ramallah Governorate. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
- In the Hebron-area village of Beit Ummar, Israeli occupation Army (IOA) escorted army rabbis entered the village's main mosque, which hosts the tomb of Nabi Matta, also known as Matthew's Tomb, sparking clashes in which one Palestinian teenager was injured. The IOA detained Muhammad Khalil Abd al-Fattah Sabarneh, 32, Shihada Yousif Shihada Adi, 30, and Moussa Khalid Ayyad Awwad, 17 during the clashes. (Maannews 29 June 2017)

Israeli Settler Violence

- Dozens of far-right Israelis attacked three Palestinians in Jerusalem a week earlier, as Israeli police failed to respond and prevent the assault. Some 30 members of the Jewish group Lehava purportedly assaulted

three Palestinians during a march organized by the group in downtown Jerusalem last Thursday. The Palestinians, who are all residents of occupied East Jerusalem, run into an Israeli police officer, who blocked the group of Israelis from approaching the Palestinians, and told the Jewish youths to leave. The youths refused and continued to hurl insults at the Palestinians. (Maannews 29 June 2017)

- Hundreds of Israeli settlers blocked a road in the northern occupied West Bank. Between 500 and 600 Israelis escorted by Israeli occupation army and police forces gathered on the main road linking the Palestinian cities of Nablus and Ramallah near the Zaatara military checkpoint in the Nablus Governorate, blocking traffic in the area. (Maannews 29 June 2017)

Home Demolition & Demolition threats

- Israeli Occupation Army (IOA) delivered a stop-work order in the town of Idhna in the southern occupied West Bank Governorate of Hebron. Israeli authorities delivered the notice to Sharif al-Jiawi for a one-story home in the al-Ras area of western Idhna in which six family members are currently residing. While the warrant was dated June 22, al-Jiawi said that he had not seen the document until Wednesday, a week later. (Maannews 29 June 2017)
