Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 4 September 2021

I he daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli occupation Army

- The Israeli occupation Army (IOA) attacked Palestinian students as they were on their way to their schools in Shufat refugee camp, north of occupied East Jerusalem. The IOA raided the camp provoking clashes with the residents. The forces fired tear gas canisters and sound bombs at the students and homes in the camp causing several cases of suffocation from inhaling the gas. (WAFA 4 September 2021)
- The Israeli occupation Army (IOA) injured several Palestinians during the weekly procession in Kufur Qaddoum town, east of Qalqilia, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The IOA fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at the protesters. It added that a young man was shot with a rubber-coated steel bullet in the head, and was rushed to a hospital in Qalqilia. Many Palestinians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation, cuts, and bruises,
- The Israeli occupation Army (IOA) detained, a young man identified as Mohammad Khader Abu al-Hummus, during a nonviolent activity against the Israeli attempts to remove and displace the Palestinian families from their homes in <u>Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood</u>, in occupied Jerusalem. Mohammad is from the al-'Isawiya town, in Jerusalem. (IMEMC 4 September 2021)
- The Israeli occupation Army (IOA) attacked a group of Palestinians who were protesting the Israeli settlement expansion in Beita village, wounding at least 20. The soldiers also opened fire on four ambulances carrying people who had been wounded by army fire. Fifty more Palestinians suffered from tear gas inhalation. 20 civilians were wounded by rubber-coated metal bullets, and over a hundred Palestinian civilians suffered from tear gas inhalation as a result of the Israeli forces firing tear gas canisters, in addition to the use of unmanned drone aircraft to stop teargas canisters into the crowd. Among those who suffered from tear gas inhalation were a number of medics who were targeted while treated the wounded. (IMEMC 4 September 2021)

• The Israeli occupation Army (IOA) attacked a group of journalists covering a protest in the South Hebron Hills several days ago, with one of the IOA telling the reporters as they seized their cameras and took them into custody that the army had orders to "go after journalists. The IOA arrested seven Palestinian journalists who were reporting on a non-violent protest against illegal settlements in the South Hebron Hills in the West Bank. Journalists were cuffed and taken to a police station where they were later released. Mashour Wahwah, one of the detained journalists, stated that he was photographing the Israeli military abducting several Palestinian youth, but that there had been no confrontations and the army did not need to use any riot control measures. Home Demolition & Demolition threats

• A Palestinian citizen from the occupied Jerusalem neighborhood of Silwan embarked on demolishing his own home after he was forced to do so by Israeli municipality of West Jerusalem to avoid paying exorbitant costs if the municipality carries out the demolition on its own. Ayman Abu Wahdan said he was forced to demolish his own home after the Israeli municipality issued a demolition order for the home under the pretext it was built without a permit. Abu wahdan had no choice but to demolish the 50-square-meter home to avoid paying unreasonable demolition costs to the Israeli municipality. (IMEMC 4 September 2021)

Other

• The Israeli municipality in Occupied Jerusalem has started to Judaize and change the Arabic names of historic streets in the Old City into Hebrew names. An Israeli municipal crew recently removed the wall sign of "al-Wad Street" in the Old City and replaced it with a new plate carrying the Hebrew name "Hagevura." Al-Wad Street starts from Bab al-Amud area in the north of the Old City and runs southwards to al-Wad neighborhood near the Aqsa Mosque's western wall. Israeli municipality had also Judaized the name of the Umayyad Palaces area near the Aqsa Mosque's southern wall as well as alleys and streets in the east Jerusalem district of Silwan, south of the Old City.
