Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 12 March 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Israeli Settler Violence

- A group of settlers set up caravans in Birin area, east of Yatta, near a monument they erected three years ago in the area, in an attempt to establish a new settlement outpost. (PALINFO 12 March 2022)
- Israeli Settlers fired live bullets at Palestinian shepherds and their sheep in the village of Janba, south of Hebron. (PALINFO 12 March 2022)
- Israeli colonizers installed a new outpost on stolen Palestinian land in the Birin area, east of Yatta, south of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The colonizers installed three mobile homes and started infrastructure work near a memorial they installed on the stolen Palestinian lands three years earlier. The colonizers forced the Palestinians out of the area while Israeli soldiers stood and watched without intervening. (IMEMC 12 March 2022)
- At least 817 Jewish settlers desecrated the Aqsa Mosque in Occupied Jerusalem last week. The Israeli occupation police provided protection for the settlers during their provocative tours at the Aqsa Mosque and allowed them to perform Talmudic prayers in its eastern area near the Bab al-Rahma prayer hall. While allowing settlers to defile the Islamic holy site, the police still persist in imposing restrictions on entry of Muslim worshipers, and banish several Jerusalemite citizens from entering their holy site every once in a while. - Jewish groups have incited their followers to march en masse to the Aqsa Mosque next Wednesday and Thursday (16 & 17 of March) to celebrate the Purim festival, which is the first Jewish celebratory occasion in 2022. The temple groups would try to perform Purim rituals and prayers inside the Aqsa Mosque compound and at its gates, adding that senior rabbis would participate in the event. Settlers will also try to bring Purim gears, including whistles, into the Islamic holy site, and they will dance and sing provocatively and hysterically at its gates and entrances as they did in recent years. Home Demolition & Demolition threats

• The Israeli army issued demolition orders against twenty Palestinian homes in the ad-Dyouk at-Tihta village, west of Jericho, in northeastern West Bank. The Israeli army claims the homes were constructed without

permits from the so-called "Civil Administration Office. However, the homes are all built on privately-owned Palestinian lands that had ownership deeds from the government of Jordan before the year 1967, when Israel occupied the rest of Palestine. One of the Palestinians, Maan Tannous, 39, said that his wife, and two children, built their two-story home on lands they own in the village. The property is only 120 square meters. (IMEMC 12 March 2022)
