

Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 26 April 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- A young Palestinian man was shot and seriously injured by Israeli soldiers in Aqabat Jaber refugee camp, southwest of Jericho city in the northeastern West Bank and later has succumbed to his wounds. The young man was identified as Ahmad Ibrahim Oweidat, 20, and was shot with a live round in the head. A second-year university student, Ahmad was shot when Israeli soldiers and undercover officers infiltrated the refugee camp, leading to protests before shooting and seriously wounded him. The soldiers also shot three other Palestinians with live fire during the protests that took place after the army invaded the refugee camp. The soldiers also invaded and ransacked several homes in the refugee camp before abducting Mohammad Abdullah Treiq and his son Hamza. (IMEMC 26 April 2022)
- Israeli soldiers invaded many Palestinian homes in Kharsa village and Yatta town, near the southern West Bank city of Hebron, and violently searched them before summoning a young man for interrogation. Several army jeeps invaded Kharsa village southwest of Hebron before the soldiers stormed and ransacked many homes and interrogated several Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. The soldiers also handed Ibrahim Abdul-Majid Shadid a warrant summoning his son, Abdul-Majid, for interrogation after failing to locate him during the invasion. (IMEMC 26 April 2022)
- In Yatta town, south of Hebron, the Israeli soldiers invaded and violently searched many homes owned by Palestinians from the local Makhamra family. (IMEMC 26 April 2022)
- Israeli soldiers and undercover units invaded Aqabat Jaber refugee camp, south of Jericho city in the northeastern West Bank, shot three Palestinians, including one who suffered life-threatening wounds and has succumbed to his wounds. The Israeli soldiers shot Ahmad Ibrahim Oweidat, 20, with a live round in the head, causing life-threatening wounds. A second-year university student, Ahmad was shot when Israeli soldiers and undercover officers infiltrated the refugee camp, leading to protests before shooting and seriously wounded him. The soldiers also shot three other Palestinians with live fire during the protests that took place after the army invaded the

refugee camp. The soldiers also invaded and ransacked several homes in the refugee camp before abducting Mohammad Abdullah Treiq and his son Hamza. (IMEMC 26 April 2022)

Erection of Israeli checkpoints

• The Israeli army installed roadblocks on Hebron's northern and southern roads and the main streets leading to the towns of Beit Awwa, Sa'ir, and Halhoul. The soldiers stopped and searched dozens of cars and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 26 April 2022)

Israeli Closures

• The Israeli occupation authority (IOA) decided to impose further restrictions on Palestinians' access to al-Aqsa Mosque, coinciding with Laylatul Qadr, the 27th of Ramadan. According to the new regulations, men under the age of 40 will not be allowed to enter the compound or pray there. However, men aged between 40 and 50 need permits to do so. Only men over the age of 50, women of all ages, and children under the age of 12 are allowed in without restrictions. Since the start of the holy month of Ramadan, Palestinians' access to al-Aqsa has been tightly restricted, while Jewish settlers are allowed in under police protection. (PALINFO 26 April 2022)
