Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine

28 April 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Dozens of Palestinian worshipers suffered breathing problems after being targeted by an Israeli drone at al-Aqsa Mosque. Israeli police attacked the worshipers shortly after performing Laylat al-Qadr and the Fajr prayer at the holy shrine. An Israeli drone also dropped teargas bombs on the worshipers. Many worshipers were treated after suffering from teargas suffocation during the attack. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)
- The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) targeted Palestinian farmers near the border fence east of Khan Yunis in the southern Gaza Strip. Israeli soldiers opened fire at Palestinian farmers working in their agricultural lands east of Khan Yunis, forcing them to leave the area. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)
- The Israeli navy detained two fishermen for several hours and seized their fishing boat while sailing off Gaza shores. The two fishermen were later released after being investigated. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)
- The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) targeted Palestinian farmers near the border fence east of Khan Yunis in the southern Gaza Strip. Israeli soldiers opened fire at Palestinian farmers working in their agricultural lands east of Khan Yunis, forcing them to leave the area. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)
- The Israeli navy detained two fishermen for several hours and seized their fishing boat while sailing off Gaza shores. The two fishermen were later released after being investigated. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)
- Israeli occupation forces (IOF) detained a Palestinian merchant while crossing the Beit Hanun (Erez) crossing from Gaza Strip en route to the West Bank. Ahmed al-Dalo, who has a merchant permit, was detained by the IOF at the crossing. The IOF had detained three merchants at the Beit Hanun crossing since the start of 2022. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)

Israeli Settler Violence

- Jewish settlers razed Palestinian-owned lands in al-Naqoura and Sebastia villages northwest of the West Bank city of Nablus. The settlers embarked on razing Palestinian-owned lands, for which citizens have all needed ownership documents, in basin 12 of Naqoura village and basin 4 of

Sebastia village near Nablus-Jenin Street. The lands were razed to expand the settlement of Shavei Shomron. (PALINFO 28 April 2022)

Confiscation & Razing of lands

- Israeli soldiers bulldozed Palestinian agricultural lands and installed several military tents in the Masafer Yatta area, south of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers bulldozed seven kilometers of Palestinian lands in Jinba, al-Halawa, and al-Markaz communities. The soldiers are trying to impose a tight siege on the area, especially the lands near the Annexation Wall, to prevent the workers from crossing through breaches of the illegal Wall. The soldiers installed several military tents around many Bedouin and farming communities in Masafer Yatta to surround and isolate the area. (IMEMC 28 April 2022)

Other

- Six Israeli reserve battalions will be stationed along the illegal Apartheid Wall that isolates the occupied West Bank from Israel. The decision to call up reserve battalions in replacement of regular forces was approved by the Chief of the Israeli Army, Aviv Kohavi, in order to prevent Palestinians from entering Israel without passing through one of the occupation's illegal checkpoints in the West Bank. According to the military, the call-ups, which will stretch over "several rounds", will be done in a way "that will enable the optimal deployment of the forces in the Central Command, and maintenance of operational competence and routine training in the IDF." This comes after Israeli ministers voted unanimously to allocate 300 million shekels (\$93 million) to improve a 40-kilometer section of the Apartheid Wall earlier this month. Late Prime Minister, Yitzhak Rabin, suggested the erection of the Wall in the 1990s, but work only began during the Second Intifada in 2000. Only 708 kilometers of the wall have been completed, comprising 62 percent of the entire project. (PNN 28 April 2022)
