Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 2 July 2022

In the daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli occupation Army

- The Israeli occupation's navy attacked Palestinian fishing boats this evening off the southern shores of the Gaza Strip, forcing fishermen to return to the shore. The Israeli navy fired live bullets and opened high-velocity streams of water towards fishermen sailing approximately six nautical miles away from the city of Khan Yunis, forcing them to stop fishing and return to the shore. Israeli naval forces and their gunboats have long been harassing Gaza fishermen, shooting at them, damaging their boats and making arrests. In some occasions, fishermen were injured or even killed during gunfire attacks by the Israeli navy. (WAFA 2 July 2022)
- The Palestinian woman, the oldest female detainee imprisoned by Israel, died in an Israeli prison less than seven months after Israeli soldiers abducted her. Sa'diyya Farajallah, 68, from Ethna town west of the southern West Bank city of Hebron, died at the ad-Damoun Israeli prison and added that the circumstances that led to her death remain unknown. Farajallah, a married mother of eight, was the oldest Palestinian female detainee in Israeli prisons and that she was abducted by the Israeli soldiers on December 18, 2021, near the Ibrahimi Mosque in Hebron, after she was injured when many illegal Israeli colonizers attacked her. The Israeli authorities prevented her family from visiting her throughout her imprisonment; she died at the Damoun Israeli prison. The woman had diabetes and high blood pressure and was taking medications before she was taken, prisoner. (IMEMC 2 July 2022)
- Israeli soldiers shot a young man with live fire and caused dozens of Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation in Jaba' town and Fahma village, south of Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. In Jaba', the soldiers installed a roadblock at the town's main entrance, preventing the Palestinians from crossing, leading to protests. The soldiers shot and moderately injured a young man with a live round and caused dozens of Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. Protests also occurred when several army jeeps invaded

Fahma village; many Palestinians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation. (IMEMC 2 July 2022)

- Israeli soldiers injured many Palestinians in the Bab az-Zawiya area in Hebron city, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers invaded the area, leading to protests, and fired many live rounds, including expanding bullets and gas bombs at the Palestinians and surrounding shops. The soldiers shot three young men with expanding bullets, causing moderate wounds. Many Palestinians also suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers closed several roads in the area, preventing the Palestinians from crossing, and searching homes and stores. (IMEMC 2 July 2022)
- Israeli soldiers fired many live rounds at Palestinian farmers and fishermen in several parts of the Gaza Strip. The soldiers behind the perimeter fence fired a barrage of live fire at the farmers east of the Judur ed-Deek area, southeast of Gaza city. The soldiers also fired live rounds at farmers east of the al-Maghazi refugee camp in central Gaza and east of the al-Qarara and Abasan al-Kabeera towns, east of Khan Younis in the southern part of the coastal region. The attacks did not lead to casualties but forced the farmers to leave their land, fearing further violations. Also, Israeli navy ships fired many live rounds at Palestinian fishing boats near the shore of Rafah, in the southern part of the Gaza Strip, forcing them to leave. (IMEMC 2 July 2022)
- Palestinian farmers cultivating their lands adjacent to the northeastern perimeter fence of the Gaza Strip came under Israeli gunfire forcing them to leave their work areas for a safe haven. The Israeli soldiers stationed at a military watchtower east of Jabalia town, north of the Gaza Strip, opened gunfire and fired tear gas canisters at farmers working in their lands, forcing them to leave the area. No one was reported injured in the shooting attack. (WAFA 2 July 2022)

Israeli Settler Violence

• Israeli forces detained five Palestinians during the weekly anti-expulsion protest in Sheikh Jarrah, while Jewish settlers assaulted the protesters, the Middle East Monitor reported. A number of Israeli settlers spread in the

area during the weekly protest and attacked the protesters as soon as they had arrived near a farm of the Salem family. The settlers stole the Palestine flag from the protesters and tore it up, adding that the settlers' aggression on the protesters continued in the presence of the Israeli occupation police. In addition, the Israeli police attacked the protesters and detained five of them, including a minor, while they were on their way home. (PC 2 July 2022)
