Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 10 October 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats the occupied Palestinian territory, confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians properties, the erection of checkpoints, construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and\or news sources.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- On Monday, the Palestinian Health Ministry confirmed the death of a child who, on September 28 was shot and seriously injured by Israel army fire when the soldiers also killed four young Palestinian men in Jenin and Jenin refugee camp in the northern West Bank. The Health Ministry identified the slain child as Mahmoud Mohammad Sammoudi, 12, from Al-Yamoun town, west of Jenin. The <u>four Palestinians killed</u> on the day of the invasions of Jenin and its refugee camp were identified as Mohammad Hisham Abu Na'sa, 25, Abdul-Rahman Fathi Khazem, 27, Ahmad Nathmi Alawna, 24, and Mohammad Mahmoud Barahma, 30. On the day of the Israeli invasion, the soldiers injured forty-four Palestinians, including several young men and children, who suffered life-threatening wounds. The child's death brings the number of Palestinians killed by Israeli fire since the beginning of this year to 165. (IMEMC 10 October 2022)
- On Monday noon, Israeli soldiers invaded the Dahiat as-Salam area, northeast of occupied Jerusalem, and injured a Palestinian man before abducting his son. Local nonviolent activist Mahmoud Elian said the soldiers fired concussion grenades at Abu Ali Salayma, wounding him in the abdomen when he tried to stop them from abducting his son, Ali, 24. Elian added that the soldiers also assaulted the man, who suffered various wounds before Palestinian medics rushed him to a hospital in Jerusalem. The soldiers also invaded the Ras Khamis neighborhood in the Shu'fat refugee camp, broke into and ransacked shops, and confiscated surveillance recordings and equipment. In addition, the soldiers stormed and ransacked many homes in the refugee camp, and in Anata town, in addition to stopping, searching, and interrogating many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards and forcing all shops and stores to close. - On Monday dawn, Israeli soldiers invaded the Al-Fawar refugee camp north of the southern West Bank city of Hebron before assaulting and abducting two Palestinian siblings. Media sources said several army jeeps invaded the refugee camp before the soldiers stormed and ransacked homes. They added that the soldiers repeatedly assaulted Osaid Nasim

Tartouri, 21, and his brother Khalil, 18, before abducting him. The soldiers also closed several surrounding areas, installed roadblocks, stopped and searched many cars, and interrogated the Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 10 October 2022)

- Palestinian schools in Anata, and Shu'fat refugee camp, in occupied Jerusalem in the West Bank, decided to shut down due to continued Israeli invasions and sieges. The Parents Committees in Anata and the Shu'fat refugee camp held a meeting Sunday evening and decided to temporarily close the schools due to serious risks to the lives of the children, teachers, and staffers, as a result of continued Israeli offensive and invasions. The Committees said the closure of the school applies to all schools in Anata town and Shu'fat refugee camp, adding that the decision was made after 24 hours of Israeli siege and invasions that are still ongoing. The Israeli army also isolated Anata and Shu'fat, barring the Palestinians from entering or leaving them, in addition to the continuous invasions and violent searches of homes and buildings. The invasions are met with massive protests while the soldiers fired many live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. The Israeli army decided to isolate Shu'fat and Anata after two Israeli officers were injured in a shooting attack near Shu'fat, before the Israeli army initiated a massive research campaign in the area, invaded homes, and abducted many Palestinians. - ens of thousands of Palestinian citizens in Shuafat refugee camp and Anata town in east Jerusalem have been isolated and besieged by the Israeli occupation forces (IOF) since Saturday's shooting operation that killed a female soldier and injured two others at the Shuafat checkpoint. Entrances and exits to the camp and town have been closed off as Israeli forces began search and arrest raids in the area as part of a large-scale campaign to find the Palestinians responsible for the Shuafat shooting operation. The IOF reportedly fired volleys of tear gas and stun grenades on Sunday evening at stranded Palestinian vehicles and citizens at the Anata town junction after youths threw one Molotov cocktail at a group of soldiers. According to Palestinian media outlets, the IOF brutally assaulted a young man at the Anata junction as young men were distributing bottled water and meals among the stranded citizens in the area. The IOF also assaulted and detained a young man at the Shuafat checkpoint, while youths torched tires near the Israeli separation wall in ar-Ram town in northern Jerusalem. A

Palestinian girl was reportedly kidnaped by Israeli police officers outside the Aqsa Mosque after she left the holy site on Sunday afternoon. In a separate incident, the IOF kidnaped a Palestinian citizen from his home in Abu Shukhaydam town, north of Ramallah. Local sources said that Israeli troops raided a number of homes in Abu Shukhaydam and detonated the entrance of an apartment building before kidnaping a citizen identified as Adham Qandah. The IOF also fired rubber bullets at journalists as they were trying to cover the Israeli raid on the town, while local youths clashed with soldiers in the nearby village of al-Mazra'a al-Gharbiya. - Several Palestinians Monday evening sustained injuries in a settler attack in the city of Hebron, according to WAFA correspondent. He said that a group of armed settlers, under military protection, assaulted Palestinians in Tal Rumeida neighborhood and Ash-Shuhada Street, pelting them with stones and empty bottles and spewing pepper spray in their faces, causing several to suffocate. All the suffocation cases received treatment at the scene. (WAFA 10 October 2022)
- The Israeli army today, and for the third day, kept all exits from Shufat refugee camp and nearby Anata town, northeast of Jerusalem, where at least 100,000 Palestinians live, under forced lockdown after shutting down all checkpoints, according to local sources. At the same time, the Israeli occupation forces continued to raid homes in the two communities, clash with residents and detain people as hundreds of soldiers, security agents, police, and members of the intelligence continue to search for a Palestinian they claim has carried out a fatal attack on Saturday night at the Shufat refugee camp army checkpoint, killing a woman soldier and critically injuring a security man. The army has prevented all residents, including students, from leaving the camp, which is separated from East Jerusalem by an eight-meter-high concrete wall and a military checkpoint despite the fact that it is located within the Jerusalem municipal boundaries. Hundreds were also left stranded inside and outside the camp and town as the army prevented them from leaving or entering these areas after locking it down following the shooting attack prompting Palestinians to offer them food and shelter while they wait for the army to reopen the checkpoints once again. Reports from the refugee camp said at least 20 people were arrested since the attack, including, according to army claims, members of the family of the alleged attacker. (WAFA 10 October 2022)

Israeli Settler Violence

- On Monday evening, illegal paramilitary Israeli colonizers attacked and injured several Palestinians in the Tal Romeida neighborhood and Shuhada Street, in the center of Hebron city, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. Media sources said the colonizers attacked many Palestinians and hurled stones and empty bottles at them, in addition to attacking a few with pepper spray. They added that the attack led to eight injuries; six received treatment from Palestinian medics, and two were moved to the Hebron Governmental Hospital. Tal Romeida and the Shuhada Street area are subject to ongoing Israeli violations by the colonizers and the soldiers, including the invasions of homes and the assaulting of children, amidst constant attempts to remove the Palestinians from the area. In related news, Israeli soldiers invaded the Aseeda area in Beit Ummar town, north of Hebron, leading to protests. The soldiers fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion n grenades, causing several injuries, mainly due to the effects of tear gas inhalation. (IMEMC 10 October 2022)
- On Monday, illegal Israeli colonizers attacked a Palestinian family while picking olive trees in its orchard in the Khallet Hassan area in Biddya village, west of the central West Bank city of Salfit, wounding two Palestinians, including a child. The WAFA Palestinian News Agency said the colonizers assaulted the family the Raed Abu Saif, 50, wounding him and his son, Arafat, 17, before Palestinian medics transferred the father and his son to a hospital in Salfit. The colonizers also fired several rounds of live ammunition while trying to force the family out of its orchard. Khallet Hassan, only 4000 Dunams, is subject to constant Israeli violations, especially since Israel is trying to build a new illegal colony to link it with five existing colonies and several colonialist outposts between the governorate of Salfit and Qalqilia. - A week after fanatic Jewish settlers had desecrated the Ibrahimi Mosque in the southern West Bank city of Hebron with singing and dancing, settles today desecrated the Muslim holy book, the Quran, burning copies, tearing them and then trashing them near the Ibrahimi Mosque, according to a local official. Nidal Jaabari, director of the Hebron Waqf department, told WAFA that settlers tore and burnt copies of the Quran and then threw them in the trash near the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old town of Hebron, which is under full Israeli military rule and where several hardcore settlement enclaves are located, considering this act as an affront to Muslims and Islam. Israel usually closes the Ibrahimi Mosque, also known as the Cave of the

Patriarchs, to Muslims during Jewish holidays and allows only Jews to be present in it. (IMEMC 10 October 2022)

- Dozens of extremist Jewish settlers desecrated the Aqsa Mosque in Occupied Jerusalem under tight police protection on Monday morning and later in the afternoon. At least 278 settlers entered the Mosque in different groups through its Maghariba Gate and toured its courtyards under police guard, according to al-Qastal News website. During their tours at the Islamic holy site, the settlers received lectures from rabbis about the alleged temple mount and a number of them provocatively performed Talmudic prayers. Meanwhile, the Israeli occupation police imposed movement restrictions on Muslim worshipers at the Aqsa Mosque's entrances and gates. (IMEMC 10 October 2022)
- An extremist Jewish settler opened fire on Sunday evening at a group of Palestinian citizens in Silwan district, south of the Agsa Mosque in Occupied Jerusalem. According to local sources, the settler opened fire at citizens in Wadi Qaddum area in Silwan, but luckily no one was hurt in the shooting attack. Meanwhile, ongoing clashes reportedly took place yesterday in the east Jerusalem refugee camp of Shuafat between local youths and Israeli police forces. Local sources said that Israeli forces fired rubber bullets and volleys of tear gas canisters and stun grenades during skirmishes with local youths in the camp. Police forces also stormed Anata town in the northeast of Jerusalem, encircled a Mosque in as-Salam suburb and confiscated security camera recordings from commercial stores. An Israeli female soldier was killed and another one suffered critical injuries in a shooting operation that targeted the military checkpoint near Shuafat refugee camp on Saturday evening. Since the incident, the Israeli occupation forces have been carrying out raids on homes and arrests in different areas of Jerusalem, especially in Shuafat camp and Anata town. - Jewish fanatics today marked the first day of the Sukkot holiday with the storming of the Muslim holy place, Al-Aqsa Mosque, and holding provocative marches through the narrow streets of Jerusalem's occupied Old City, reported WAFA correspondent. She said dozens of Jewish fanatics broke into Al-Aqsa Mosque after Israeli police cleared the yards of the holy compound from the Muslim worshippers in order to facilitate the presence of the fanatics, some of whom performed rituals in violation of a decades-long status quo that ban non-Muslims from holding prayers of any kind in its premises. At the same time, fanatics marched through the Old

City streets while holding rituals near the gates leading to Al-Aqsa Mosque. (WAFA 10 October 2022)
