

Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 11 October 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- On Tuesday night, Israeli soldiers attacked and injured two Palestinians in villages near Hebron and caused many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation in Hebron city, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. Rateb Jabour, the coordinator of the National and Popular Committees against the Annexation Wall and Colonies, said the soldiers invaded Susiya village, south of Hebron, and repeatedly assaulted a Palestinian man, Bassam Nawaj'a, in his home. Jabour said Nawaj'a suffered various cuts and bruises before Palestinian medics rushed him to Abu Hasan Al-Qassem Hospital in Hebron. The soldiers also invaded Khirbat Zannouta village, south of Hebron, and Ghwein village, east of the city, searched many homes and photographed them. During the Zannouta invasion, the soldiers assaulted and injured Mohammad Ismael Daghamin, before Palestinian medics transferred him to a medical center. In Hebron city, the soldiers invaded the Be'er Haram Ar-Rama area, leading to protests, before they fired many gas bombs and concussion grenades at the protesters and surrounding homes. Medical sources said many Palestinians, including those in their homes, suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation. In Bethlehem, the soldiers installed an iron gate at the main entrance of Beit Fajjar town, south of the city, and closed it before stopping and searching dozens of cars and barring the Palestinians from crossing. The Israeli army frequently installs roadblocks at the entrance of the town in illegal acts of collective punishment against the Palestinians. (IMEMC 11 October 2022)
- An Israeli soldier was seriously injured Tuesday in a shooting targeting a large group of colonizers marching near Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The Israeli army said the wounded soldier, 20, suffered a serious gunshot wound to the upper body before he received treatment at the scene and was rushed to an Israeli hospital. The army added that the shooting occurred near the colony's eastern gate and stated that the wounded soldier was shot in the shoulder; his condition was initially described as mild but later deteriorated and was classified as serious. The shooting occurred when dozens of colonizers marched near the illegal Shvei Shomron colony, built on stolen Palestinian lands west of Nablus. According to a preliminary investigation by the Israeli army, a

Palestinian opened fire from a moving car near the colony before the vehicle sped away. Following the shooting, the Israeli army pushed more troops into the area, invaded all nearby Palestinian villages and towns, and initiated a massive search campaign for the shooter and the car. The army also closed all military roadblocks leading to Nablus. (IMEMC 11 October 2022)

- On Tuesday dawn, Israeli soldiers abducted a Palestinian man and his son • from Anata town and continued the siege of Shu'fat refugee camp, northeast of the occupied Palestinian capital, Jerusalem, in the West Bank. Many army vehicles invaded Anata before the soldiers stormed, ransacked a few homes, and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. Local sources said the soldiers abducted Jamal Tamimi, and his son Khaled, after invading their homes and searching them, causing damage. Furthermore, the Israeli army continued the strict siege in Anata and Shu'fat refugee camp, and earlier Tuesday, stormed a home for the Tamimi family and took measurements of the property in preparation for demolishing it. Dozens of Palestinians protested the invasion before the soldiers fired a few live rounds and a barrage of gas bombs at the protesters and surrounding homes, causing many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The area has been subject to the constant siege, invasions, searches of homes, and abductions of many Palestinians since Saturday evening after an Israeli soldier and an armed civilian guard were shot by a Palestinian at a military roadblock near Shu'fat. - Earlier Tuesday, Israeli soldiers invaded the al-Mas'udiyya archeological area in Burqa Palestinian town northwest of Nablus in the northern part of the occupied West Bank and isolated fourteen families. Ghassan Daghlas, a Palestinian official who monitors Israel's illegal colonialist activities in the northern West Bank, said the soldiers imposed a strict siege around Al-Mas'udiyya and the area of the nearby permanent military roadblock on the Main Nablus-Jenin Road. Daghlas said fourteen Palestinian families living on their lands near Al-Mas'udiyya have been surrounded and isolated, unable to enter or leave the area. The official also stated that illegal Israeli colonizers invaded the isolated area and installed many tents and sheds on the Palestinian lands in preparation for spending Jewish holidays there. Al-Mas'udiyya is an archeological area visited by thousands of Palestinians around the year and has the remains of Ottoman-era railways

that linked Haifa city with Jordan and Saudi Arabia at the time. (IMEMC 11 October 2022)

- The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) launched a large-scale raid and arrest campaign throughout the West Bank on Tuesday morning. Three Palestinians were detained after IOF broke into their family houses in Nablus. Another Palestinian was rounded up in Jenin while IOF intensified presence throughout the surrounding villages. Two more arrests were carried out in Bethlehem, while three Palestinians were detained in Occupied Jerusalem including a father and his son. Israeli police forces stormed the Tamimi family's house in the Al-Salam suburb, northeast of Occupied Jerusalem, and took its measurements as a prelude to demolishing it. Meanwhile, Israeli forces continue to isolate and besiege tens of thousands of Palestinian citizens in Shuafat refugee camp and Anata town in east Jerusalem since Saturday's shooting operation that killed a female soldier and injured two others at the Shuafat checkpoint. - Israeli forces Tuesday evening seized an excavator and two trucks from Shufa village, southeast of Tulkarm city, according to a local activist. Tahsin Hamed told WAFA correspondent that the gun-toting soldiers barged their way into the western street of the northern West Bank village, confiscated an excavator in addition to two trucks, held their owners for some four hours and subjected them to interrogation. The soldiers, Hamed added, forced the drivers to drive the confiscated machinery to the nearby colonial settlement of Avnei Hefetz. (WAFA 11 October 2022)

Israeli Settler Violence

 On Tuesday night, illegal paramilitary Israeli colonizers attacked four Palestinian homes in Sinjil town, north of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, causing damage. Local sources said the paramilitary colonizers invaded the town and hurled stones at four Palestinian homes, causing damage to windows and anxiety attacks among the children. The sources added that the paramilitary colonizers came from the nearby illegal colonies of Givat Harel, Haroeh, Shilo, and Ma'ale Levona, built on stolen Palestinian lands in Sinjil and several surrounding villages and towns. Furthermore, dozens of colonizers gathered at the intersection of Hares village, west of the central West Bank city of Salfit, and marched in the area carrying Israeli flags and chanting slogans calling for expelling the Palestinians from their homes and lands. - On Tuesday, illegal Israeli colonizers injured a Palestinian man after attacking his car near Huwwara town, south of Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. Ghassan Daghlas, a Palestinian official who monitors Israel's illegal colonialist activities in the northern West Bank, said the colonizers hurled stones at Palestinian cars, causing damage and wounding one man. Daghlas added that the wounded Palestinian, from Jamma'in nearby town, southwest of Nablus, suffered various wounds to the head. The colonizers also attacked the home of Bilal Yousef Dmeidi in the eastern area of Huwwara, causing damage to several windows before the locals intercepted the attack and forced them to leave. - A group of Jewish settlers attacked Palestinian vehicles passing near the • vicinity of Beit El illegal settlement north of Ramallah on Tuesday evening. Under Israeli occupation forces' protection, the settlers stoned the Palestinian vehicles, smashing the windows of one of them. Palestinian activists launched calls for intensifying presence near the area and to confront the settler attack and protect local homes. A similar attack was reported near Ein Ayoub area, where several vehicles were stoned and attacked. In Nablus, a Palestinian was injured after being hit in the head by a stone during a settler attack near the village of Al-Lubban Al-Sharqiya, south of the city. Several vehicles were also damaged during the attack at Nablus-Ramallah road. Meanwhile, another group of settlers closed the road leading to the northern Jordan Valley and attacked Palestinian vehicles. Local activist Moataz Bisharat affirmed that IOF soldiers were deployed in the area and did not intervene to stop the attack. The Jordan Valley area is subjected to almost daily settler attacks under the protection of the IOF. (PALINFO 11 October 2022)
- Israeli police on Tuesday stormed the Shuafat refugee camp and Anata town, northwest of Occupied Jerusalem, which triggered clashes with local youths near the checkpoint of Shuafat camp. Local sources reported that Israeli police fired live bullets and tear gas bombs at Palestinians in Assalam suburb in Anata town, in addition to opening the sewage water on the streets of Shuafat camp. For the fourth day in a row, the Israeli police forces kept the Shuafat refugee camp and Anata town, where at least 100,000

Palestinians live, under forced lockdown. The closure comes as part of the Israeli measures during the ongoing search for the suspect who carried out a fatal attack on Saturday night at the Shuafat checkpoint, which resulted in killing an Israeli soldier and injuring two others. Meanwhile, the Israeli police stormed the home of the suspect and took its measurements as a prelude to demolishing it, in addition to detaining 11 Palestinians, seven of whom are the suspect's family members.  The Israeli police forces stormed Al-Aqsa Mosque in large numbers on Tuesday on the second day of the so-called "Jewish Throne Day" to pave the way for Jewish settlers' incursion. Jerusalemite sources affirmed that the Israeli forces stormed the Al-Qibli prayer hall and forced out the Palestinian worshipers. Meanwhile, large groups of extremist Jewish settlers were allowed into the Al-Aqsa Mosque. During their tours at the Islamic holy site, the settlers received lectures from rabbis about the alleged temple mount and a number of them provocatively performed Talmudic prayers. The Israeli occupation police imposed movement restrictions on Muslim worshipers at the Al-Aqsa Mosque's entrances and gates. (PALINFO 11 October 2022)

Israeli Closures

The Israeli siege on Shufat refugee camp and nearby Anata town, northeast ۲ of Jerusalem, continued today for the fourth consecutive day as more than 1000 Jewish fanatics stormed the Muslim holy place, Al-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem's Old City, performing illegal rituals, according to various sources. Life was disrupted in Shufat refugee and Anata for the last days after the Israeli occupation authorities decided to collectively punish more than 130,000 Palestinian residents of these two neighborhoods by locking them in following a shooting attack at an army checkpoint at the camp's entrance on Saturday night that left one soldier dead and another critically wounded. Since that night, the Israeli forces closed the checkpoint that leads to occupied East Jerusalem and all access roads leading to the two neighborhoods, preventing everyone, including students, ill people, elderly, and employees from leaving the neighborhoods and supplies from entering them in what some have described as a war crime and a crime against humanity. At the same time, Israeli occupation forces continued for the fourth day to break into homes and detain people haphazardly claiming

they are looking for the person behind the attack. Young residents, meanwhile, confront the Israeli soldiers breaking into their neighborhoods, attacking them with stones and bottles, while the soldiers respond with tear gas. (WAFA 11 October 2022)
