



Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine

18 October 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- On Wednesday dawn, Israeli soldiers invaded several villages and towns and installed roadblocks, in addition to confiscating surveillance recordings and equipment, near Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. Media sources said the soldiers invaded many villages and towns, including Toura, at-Tarm, Um Dar, Arraba, al-Jalam, Rommana, Aneen, and Taybah. The sources added that the soldiers stormed and ransacked many homes and shops, causing damage, and confiscated surveillance recordings and equipment. The soldiers also conducted massive searches on lands and hills surrounding the invaded communities and installed many military roadblocks. The army stopped, searched dozens of Palestinian vehicles, and interrogated many residents while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 18 October 2022)
- Late Tuesday night, Israeli soldiers shot a young Palestinian man near Qusra village, south of Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The Israeli army claimed that soldiers shot and injured the young man after he reportedly hurled a Molotov cocktail at an army jeep. The army said its soldiers initiated a search to locate the wounded Palestinians and two other young men who allegedly were with him. Palestinian sources said several army vehicles invaded an area near Qusra village, leading to protests, and added that the soldiers fired many live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. - On Tuesday evening, Israeli soldiers invaded the al-Maghayir village northeast of Ramallah, in the central West Bank, after many illegal colonizers attacked Palestinian cars. Media sources said many illegal Israeli colonizers gathered at the village's main entrance and attacked Palestinian cars, causing damage and leading to protests. The sources added that several army jeeps invaded the village before the soldiers fired many gas bombs and concussion grenades at the Palestinians; the soldiers and the colonizers withdrew from the area shortly afterward. - On Tuesday evening, Israeli soldiers shot three Palestinian construction workers near the illegal Annexation Wall, southwest of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank and abducted them. Media sources said the soldiers fired several live rounds at many Palestinian workers near the Annexation Wall in Doura town, southwest of Hebron, wounding three. They added that the soldiers abducted the three wounded workers and took them to an unknown destination; the extent of their wounds remained unknown. In related news, the soldiers chased several Palestinian workers in the Wad Al-Amayer and Khirbat al-Kharaba areas near the as-Samu' town south of Hebron. (IMEMC 17 October 2022)
- Israeli soldiers attacked, Tuesday morning, Palestinian farmers and fishermen east of Khan Younis and northeast of Gaza city in the besieged Gaza Strip. Media sources said the soldiers, stationed across the perimeter fence, fired many gas bombs and live rounds at Palestinian farmers on their lands in the Najjar neighborhood east of Khuza'a town, east of Khan Younis, in the southern part of the coastal region. They added that Israeli navy ships fired live rounds and gas bombs at Palestinian fishing boats west of the Sudaniyya area, north of Gaza city. The attacks did not lead to casualties but caused damage and forced the fishermen and the farmers to leave, fearing further Israeli escalation. On Monday, Israeli navy ships fired many live rounds and gas bombs at Palestinian fishing boats and farmers, near Khan Younis and Gaza city. (IMEMC 17 October 2022)
- Five Palestinian journalists were injured on Monday evening when the Israeli occupation forces (IOF) attacked them at the main entrance of Deir Sharaf village in western Nablus. According to Wafa news agency, five journalists from Palestine TV suffered from different injuries when Israeli soldiers attacked them as they were working on filming a new episode of the "Malaf al-Youm" program. One of the journalists was injured when a tear gas canister hit his face, another one suffered from bruises and three others from their exposure to tear gas, Wafa said. The IOF also wreaked havoc on equipment, including cameras, belonging to the journalists. (PALINFO 17 October 2022)
- The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) fired on Tuesday morning a volley of tear gas canisters at Palestinian farmers in an agricultural area in the southeast of the besieged Gaza Strip. According to local sources, the IOF launched a teargas attack on farmers, with no reason, as they were working their lands in an-Najjar area in the east of Khuza'a town in Khan Yunis. The

- IOF attack forced the farmers to leave their fields and return home. Yesterday, cultivated fields caught fire after the IOF carried out a similar attack on farmers in the east of Gaza City. (PALINFO 17 October 2022)
- An entire Palestinian family, including children and an elderly, suffocated today after inhaling tear gas fired by Israeli forces directly at their home in Masafer Yatta to the south of Hebron, according to a local activist. Coordinator of the protection and steadfastness committees, Fuad al-amour, said Israeli forces fired stun grenades and tear gas canisters directly at the family home of Kaal Rabi in Masafer Yatta, causing the entire family to suffocate, including children. The exposure to tear gas caused Rabi's mother, an elderly, to lose consciousness. (WAFSA 18 October 2022)
 - A number of Palestinians suffocated today after inhaling tear gas fired by them by Israeli forces in the town of Sinjil to the north of Ramallah, according to local activist Ayed Ghafri. He said that Israeli settlers attacked Palestinians while they were plowing their land threatened with seizure by Israel. Israeli forces reportedly joined in on the attack and fired tear gas canisters toward farmers, causing several people to suffocate. (WAFSA 18 October 2022)

Israeli Settler Violence

- Israeli settlers today attacked Palestinian olive pickers and stole their harvest in the town of Qaffin to the north of Tulkarem, according to the town's mayor, Waleed Sabah. The mayor said that settlers beat up farmers while they were harvesting their olives in Wadi Salem area to the northeast of the town of Qaffin, causing one of the farmers multiple bruises throughout his body. Settlers reportedly chased farmers out of their lands and stole their harvest. The attack was led by an Israeli settler who took over the area three years ago and placed caravans there for raising sheep. (WAFSA 18 October 2022)
- For the second time in two weeks, hundreds of extremist Jewish settlers held and participated last night in a boisterous concert that involved singing and dancing at the Ibrahimi Mosque in al-Khalil City. The settler revelry at the Ibrahimi Mosque, which started on Monday night, continued into the early morning hours of Tuesday. Ghassan al-Rajabi, director of the Ibrahimi Mosque, explained that the Israeli occupation forces (IOF) closed the Ibrahimi Mosque to Muslim worshipers and allowed settlers from the illegal settlements of the West Bank to enter the Old City of al-Khalil in

- order to hold celebrations at the Ibrahimi Mosque. Rajabi said that the IOF imposed tight security restrictions on the southern area of al-Khalil City and the area around the Ibrahimi Mosque to secure the settler celebrations. He condemned such persistent desecration of the Mosque as part of the Israeli occupation state's settlement policy and its attempts to entirely impose its control over the Islamic holy site and the Old City of al-Khalil. He pointed out that the IOF intends to close the Mosque on November 19 for other Jewish celebrations. (PALINFO 18 October 2022)
- Amid tight police restrictions on Muslim worshipers, scores of Jewish settlers desecrated the Aqsa Mosque in Occupied Jerusalem on Tuesday morning. According to the Islamic Awqaf Administration in the holy city, dozens of settlers entered the Mosque in different groups through its Maghariba Gate and toured its courtyards under tight police guard. During their tours at the Islamic holy site, the settlers received lectures from rabbis about the alleged temple mount and a number of them provocatively performed Talmudic prayers. Meanwhile, the Israeli occupation police imposed movement and entry restrictions on Muslim worshipers at the Aqsa Mosque's entrances and gates. (PALINFO 18 October 2022)
 - Jewish settlers, protected by Israeli occupation forces, attacked Palestinian farmers and stole their harvest in the center of the West Bank city of al-Khalil on Tuesday. Wafa news agency reported that Jewish settlers attacked Palestinian farmers and foreign activists who participated in an olive picking campaign launched by the local activist group Youth against Settlements in the Tal al-Rumaida neighborhood in the center of al-Khalil. In a related development, dozens of settlers, under tight protection of Israeli police, proceeded to steal the olive harvest of Palestinian citizens after storming the Wadi al-Joz neighborhood in Occupied Jerusalem. Moreover, settlers attacked Palestinian farmers while they were picking their olives, forcing them to leave their lands northeast of Qaffin town, north of the West Bank city of Tulkarem. According to local sources, a group of Jewish settlers beat Palestinian farmers in the Wad Salim area northeast of Qaffin. The Palestinian farmer Usama Amarneh suffered several bruises all over his body as a result of the attack. (PALINFO 18 October 2022)
 - Settlers, protected by Israeli forces, today stole the olive harvest from privately-owned Palestinian land in Wadi al-Joz neighborhood of occupied Jerusalem, according to Wafa correspondent. Wafa correspondent, citing sources, said dozens of settlers broke into a privately-owned land in Wadi al-Joz and stole the olive harvest while the forces provided them with protection. Settlers and soldiers last week also broke into privately-owned

Palestinian land in the East Jerusalem neighborhood of Silwan and stole the olive harvest before the landowners came and forced them to leave the area. (Wafa 18 October 2022)

Israeli Military Orders

- The Israeli occupation authority (IOA) released two female Jerusalemite activists from Israeli jails, providing that they will be deported from the Old City of Jerusalem. An Israeli court decided to release the Jerusalemite activist Hanadi Halawani and ban her entry into the Old City for five days, in addition to imposing on her a fine of 2,000 shekels. The other activist Kefah Natsha was released and served a deportation order from the city for 25 days, in addition to imposing a fine of 700 shekels on her. (PALINFO 18 October 2022)
