

Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine 20 October 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and \or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- On Thursday morning, the Palestinian Health Ministry confirmed the death ٠ of a Palestinian child, Mohammad Fadi Nouri, 16, whom Israeli soldiers shot and seriously injured more than three weeks ago in Betunia town, west of Ramallah, in the central part of the occupied West bank. Mohammad was shot on September 28 during protests at the northern entrance of Al-Biereh city near Ramallah when the soldiers also shot and seriously injured many Palestinians. The Palestinians were protesting the death of four Palestinians, Mohammad Hisham Abu Na'sa, 25 Ahmad Nathmi Alawna, 24 Abdul-Rahman Fathi Khazem, 27 Mohammad Mahmoud Barahma, 30, who were killed by Israeli soldiers in Jenin, in the northern West Bank. On Wednesday night, Israeli soldiers killed Odai Kamal Tamimi, 22, near Ma'ale Adumim illegal colony, east of the occupied capital Jerusalem in the West Bank, after he opened fire at security guards, mildly wounded one. The Israeli army has been looking for Odai after holding him responsible for the death of an Israeli soldier, <u>Noa Lazar</u>, 18, and the serious injury of a security guard at a military roadblock near Shu'fat. A day before the soldier's death, the army killed Ahmad Mohammad Hussein Daraghma, <u>24, and Mahmoud Moayyad Sous, 18</u>, in Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. Their deaths also came just a day after the Israeli soldiers killed two Palestinian teens, Adel Ibrahim Adel Daoud, 14, and Mahdi Mohammad Ladadwa, 17, and injured dozens of Palestinians near Qalqilia and Ramallah in the northern and central parts of the occupied West Bank. - On Thursday evening, Israeli soldiers assaulted a young Palestinian man before abducting him in Sur Baher town, southeast of the occupied Palestinian capital, Jerusalem, in the West Bank. The soldiers also invaded Silwan and attacked protesters. The Wadi Hilweh Information Center In Silwan (Silwanic) said several army jeeps invaded Sur Baher, leading to protests before the soldiers fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. Silwanic added that the soldiers chased several Palestinians and stopped and repeatedly assaulted a young man, causing several injuries, before abducting him. Silwanic also said several army vehicles invaded Silwan town, south of the Al-Aqsa Mosque in

Jerusalem, and closed many roads. The soldiers stopped and searched dozens of cars and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards, leading to protests in several parts of the town, especially in the Be'er Ayyoub area. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)

- On Thursday evening, Israeli soldiers injured dozens of Palestinians near Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. Media sources said the soldiers stopped a young man at the Beit Furik military roadblock east of Nablus and repeatedly assaulted him. They added that the soldiers struck the young man with batons and rifles to several parts of his body, including the head, before Palestinian medics rushed him to a hospital in the city. In Beita town, south of Nablus, the soldiers attacked Palestinian protesters at the town's main entrance, causing at least 45 to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation and a young man injured after falling as the soldiers chased him. Also, at least six Palestinians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation during protests near the Huwwara military roadblock south of Nablus. In related news, Israeli military bulldozers placed sand mounds on many streets in and around Huwwara town. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)
- On Thursday evening, Israeli soldiers injured seven Palestinians during protests in Beit Ummar town, north of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The Palestinians were marching against the serious Israeli escalation across the West Bank when the soldiers attacked them with live fire, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. Medical sources said the soldiers shot seven Palestinians, including four who suffered gunshot wounds to their legs before they were rushed to a hospital in Hebron; three Palestinians were shot with rubber-coated steel bullets and received treatment at a local clinic. The army also attacked protesters at Hebron's northern entrance near Halhoul Bridge and the main entrance of Kharsa village. The soldiers also stopped and searched a Palestinian car eastern entrance of Halhoul bridge and abducted one Palestinian. In related news, the soldier caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation after the army invaded Husan village, west of Bethlehem city, and attacked protesters with gas bombs and concussion grenades. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)
- On Thursday, Israeli soldiers shot a young Palestinian man during protests that took place when the army invaded Nabi Saleh village, northwest of Ramallah, in the central part of the occupied West Bank. Media sources said

the protests, ongoing at the time of this report, were attacked by dozens of soldiers who fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. They added that the soldiers shot a young man with a live round in the thigh, causing excessive bleeding. The young man lost consciousness due to serious blood loss before Palestinian medics rushed him to a hospital in Ramallah. It is worth mentioning that, on Wednesday night, the soldiers closed the village's main entrance with concrete blocks, leading to protests after the army prevented the Palestinians from entering or leaving it. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)

- On Thursday, Israeli soldiers seriously shot a Palestinian teenage boy and abducted five Palestinians during protests in Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers attacked dozens of Palestinians marching in the Bab az-Zawiya area in the center of Hebron city and fired many live rounds, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. Media sources said the soldiers abducted four Palestinians, including two children, after repeatedly assaulting them, causing many injuries. Earlier Thursday, the soldiers abducted one Palestinian in the Bab az-Zawiya area and took him to an unknown destination. In Sa'ir town, northeast of Hebron, the soldiers attacked protesters and shot a teenage boy, 16 years of age, with a live round in the abdomen, inflicting life-threatening wounds and excessive bleeding, before he was rushed to a hospital where he remains in serious condition. The soldiers tried to abduct the wounded child and place him in one of their jeeps, but the locals and medics managed to take the child and rushed him to a hospital in Hebron. In Bethlehem, the soldiers attacked protesters at the city's northern entrance and fired many gas bombs, concussion grenades, and rubber-coated steel bullets. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)
- On Thursday morning, the Palestinian Health Ministry confirmed the death of a Palestinian child whom Israeli soldiers shot and seriously injured more than three weeks ago in Betunia town, west of Ramallah, in the central part of the occupied West bank. The Health Ministry said the child, Mohammad Fadi Nouri, 16, was shot with a live round in the abdomen, leading to extensive internal organ damage and bleeding, and remained in a serious condition until she succumbed to his wounds. Mohammad, from Betunia town west of Ramallah, was shot on September 28 during protests at the northern entrance of Al-Biereh city near Ramallah when the soldiers also shot and seriously injured many Palestinians. - Violent clashes broke out on Thursday between Palestinian youths and the • Israeli occupation forces (IOF) in al-Khalil and Bethlehem, amid a general strike that was staged in mourning for martyr Uday at-Tamimi. The strike, which was called for by national figures, was observed by businesses, schools, universities and different facilities in al-Khalil and Bethlehem. According to local sources, clashes took place at the northern entrance of Bethlehem City, during which the IOF intensively fired tear gas canisters and stun grenades at young protesters. No one was reportedly hurt during the events. In al-Khalil, a number of young men suffered from their exposure to tear gas during confrontations with the IOF in Bab az-Zawiya area in the central district of al-Khalil City and Dura town. Meanwhile, dozens of Palestinian citizens participated today in a march staged in Tarqumiyah town, west of al-Khalil, in solidarity with Nablus City, which has been under tight siege for 10 days. Last night, angry young men clashed with the IOF in different areas of al-Khalil following the martyrdom of Uday at-Tamimi, who was shot dead on Wednesday evening after he exchanged fire with Israeli security guards at the entrance of the illegal settlement of Ma'ale Adumim. - Two Palestinian citizens were seriously injured in the Israeli occupation forces' (IOF) violent quelling of unarmed protests in the West Bank and Jerusalem on Thursday. The Palestinian ministry of health said in a terse statement that the first casualty was reported in Sa'eer town in al-Khalil province, explaining that the victim was hit with a live bullet in his abdomen and that he was admitted into the operating theater for urgent surgery in Al-Ahli Hospital in al-Khalil city. It said that another casualty was reported in al-Ram town in Occupied Jerusalem and was also in the abdomen, adding that he was rushed to the operating room in Palestine Medical Complex for urgent surgery. Israeli Settler Violence

• On Thursday evening, illegal paramilitary colonizers kidnapped a Palestinian child from her town in occupied Jerusalem, in the West Bank, and assaulted her for several hours. Media sources said the colonizers kidnapped the child, Nourhan Ahmad Sayyad, 14, near her home in At-Tour, and assaulted her, causing various in injuries. *Update*: This is a video is from the Facebook page of <u>Anata News in Jerusalem</u>; the man in this video is interviewing or asking the Palestinians who found her about what

happened: The colonizers left the kidnapped child on the side of the road before fleeing the area. There have been no reports of arrests. After the child was abducted, her father and her uncle headed to the police station and filed several missing person reports, but the police refused to investigate the matter and attacked the uncle, who was demanding them to start investigating the issue. (IMEMC 20 October 2022)

- On Thursday, illegal paramilitary Israeli colonizers burnt a Palestinian car and uprooted many olive and almond trees and saplings in the al-Mughayyir village northeast of Ramallah. Mazen Al-Haj Mohammad said the colonizers burnt the car of Yasser, his brother, before invading the family's orchards and uprooting more than 80 olive and almond saplings and trees. He added that Israeli soldiers arrived in the area before the colonizers also burnt a water tank on his land. Many Palestinians protested the invasion and attacks before Israeli soldiers fired live rounds, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)
- On Thursday, groups of paramilitary illegal Israeli colonizers attacked Palestinians while picking their olive trees in their orchards east of Nablus, while Israeli soldiers destroyed a water pump south of the city in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. Ghassan Daghlas, a Palestinian official who monitors Israel's illegal colonialist activities in the northern West Bank, said many colonizers invaded the Palestinian orchards in Azmout town, east of Nablus. Daghlas added that the colonizers chased the Palestinians and hurled stones at them while trying to force them out of their lands. In addition, illegal colonizers and soldiers invaded Palestinian lands near Burin village, Madama, Orif, and Asira al-Qibliya villages, south of Nablus, before the army used a bulldozer to place a sand mound on the main water pump. Daghlas said the pump is essential to the residents as it provides more than 20.000 Palestinians and their agricultural lands with the needed water. (IMEMC 19 October 2022)
- On Wednesday, a group of fanatic paramilitary Israeli colonizers attacked Palestinian farmers picking their olive trees in Jamma'in village north of the central West Bank city of Salfit, wounding one. Resident Soheib Awad told the WAFA News Agency that, as he and his family were on their olive orchard in the Naqqar area, many paramilitary colonizers invaded his land and attacked the family with pepper spray and baton, moderately wounding his son. Awad said the colonizers came from the nearby Tapuach

illegal colony, built on stolen Palestinian lands. He added that the Palestinians have been subject to daily violations since the beginning of the olive harvest season. Also Wednesday, a group of paramilitary colonizers assaulted many Palestinians and international peace activists picking Palestinian olive trees in Kisan village, east of Bethlehem, and <u>stabbed a female activist</u>. - A horde of extremist Jewish settlers carried out on Thursday an arson attack on a Palestinian vehicle and destroyed trees in al-Mughayyir village, north of Ramallah. According to WAFA news agency, settlers stormed the eastern area of the village under military protection and set fire to a car. The settlers also uprooted olive and almond saplings and burned a water tank in a grove. Following the incident, dozens of local youths rallied in the eastern area of the village and torched tires to foil any further attacks by settlers. (PALINFO 19 October 2022)
- Dozens of extremist Jewish settlers desecrated the Aqsa Mosque in • Occupied Jerusalem under tight police protection on Thursday morning and later in the afternoon. At least 170 settlers, including students of religious institutes, entered the Mosque in different groups through its Maghariba Gate and toured its courtyards under police guard, according to al-Qastal News website. During their tours at the Islamic holy site, the settlers received lectures from rabbis about the alleged temple mount and a number of them provocatively performed Talmudic prayers. Meanwhile, the Israeli occupation police imposed movement restrictions on Muslim worshipers at the Aqsa Mosque's entrances and gates. The Aqsa Mosque is exposed to daily desecration by Jewish settlers and police forces in the morning and the afternoon except on Fridays and Saturdays. The Israeli police close al-Maghariba Gate, which is used by Jews to enter the Mosque, at 10:30 am after the settlers complete their morning tours at the holy site. Later in the afternoon, the same gate is reopened for evening tours by settlers. (PALINFO 19 October 2022)

Home Demolition & Demolition threats

• Israeli soldiers demolished a Palestinian home in Doura town, southwest of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. Media sources said the soldiers invaded the Khallet Taha area in Doura before surrounding the home and forcing the family of eight out. The demolished property was 120 square meters; the Israeli army claims it was built without a permit from

the so-called Civil Administration Office, the administrative branch of the illegal Israeli occupation. Last year, the soldiers demolished two homes owned by a member of the Taha family in the same area of the town. On Thursday morning, Israeli military and police vehicles invaded Silwan town, south of the Al-Aqsa Mosque in occupied Jerusalem and <u>handed a demolition order to a Palestinian elder</u>. In Hebron city, the soldiers abducted Odah Sa'id Nassar, 23, while walking in the Bab az-Zawiya area in the center of the city during protests that took place in the area. Also, On Thursday morning, the Palestinian Health Ministry confirmed the death of a Palestinian child, <u>Mohammad Fadi Nouri</u>, 16, whom Israeli soldiers shot and seriously injured more than three weeks ago in Betunia town, west of Ramallah, in the central part of the occupied West bank. On Thursday morning, Israeli military and police vehicles invaded Silwan town, south of the Al-Aqsa Mosque in occupied Jerusalem and handed a demolition order to a Palestinian elder. Media sources said the soldiers handed Yacoub Maragha, 71, an order to demolish his home within fifteen days. The police claimed that a 100 square/meter home was built without a permit from the city council on land the man owns. Many Palestinians in the occupied city resort to constructing their homes without permits due to Israel's continued refusal to issue these permits, especially since expanding families find themselves living in small homes or apartments. While Israel continues to build and expand its illegal colonies, Palestinian communities, towns, occupied Jerusalem, and various areas in the occupied West Bank, continue to be denied the right to build homes and property. Israel's colonies in the occupied West Bank, including those in and around occupied East Jerusalem, are illegal under International Law, the Fourth Geneva Convention, and various United Nations and Security Council resolutions. They also constitute war crimes under International Law. Article 49 of the Fourth Geneva Convention states: "The Occupying Power shall not deport or transfer parts of its own civilian population into the territory it occupies." It also prohibits the "individual or mass forcible transfers, as well as deportations of protected persons from occupied

Israeli Closures

• On Thursday evening, the Israeli army decided to close the major Salem military roadblock, west of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, until

further notice and invaded many homes in a nearby village before storming and ransacking homes and stores and confiscating surveillance recordings and equipment. The soldiers shut the roadblock down, causing a traffic jam extending hundreds of meters, before stopping and searching dozens of cars. The army then informed the Palestinians that the military roadblock would remain closed until further notice without providing any additional details. Furthermore, several army jeeps invaded Rommana village, west of Jenin, and installed many roadblocks on its entrances and various inner streets before storming and ransacking many shops and homes. During the invasions of the shops and homes, the soldiers interrogated many Palestinians and confiscated surveillance equipment and recordings. In related news, the soldiers closed the Al-Jalama military roadblock northeast of Jenin several times within just a few hours, leading to protests, before the army fired gas bombs, concussion grenades, and rubber-coated steel bullets.  The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) have continued to impose a tight siege on the northern West Bank city of Nablus for the tenth consecutive day. Over the past nine days, the IOF closed all entrances to the city and prevented the Palestinian movement in both directions under the pretext of searching for wanted members of Palestinian resistance groups. The siege of Nablus has resulted in a virtual halt on life here, bringing with it substantial economic repercussions, not only for Nablus residents but Palestinians across the West Bank. The Nablus district is home to over 425,000 people spread across four refugee camps, 55 villages, and one city. Virtually all of the district's residents have been affected by the closures, as they remain stalled at checkpoints, hoping to make it to work, university, or to visit friends and family who are trapped in the city, unable to make it out.
