Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine

24 March 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Israeli soldiers fired many rounds of live ammunition at Palestinian farmers east of Khan Younis in the southern part of the Gaza Strip. The soldiers stationed on military towers across the fence, east of Khan Younis, fired many live rounds at Palestinian farmlands east of Khuza'a town and the Sanati area, east of Abasan al-Kabira town. The attack did not lead to casualties but forced the farmers to leave, fearing further violations. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- Israeli soldiers invaded the Deheishe refugee camp, south of Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank, shot three young Palestinian men, and abducted three others. Dozens of soldiers invaded the refugee camp before storming and violently searching many homes. The soldiers abducted Mohammad Ramadan, 33, Yazan Mousa Manna', 24, and Omar Yousef Manna', 23, from their homes. The invasion led to protests in various parts of the refugee camp before the soldiers fired many live rounds, gas bombs, and rubber-coated steel bullets. The soldiers shot three young men with live rounds in the abdomen and legs, medical sources at Beit Jala governmental hospital said. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- Israeli navy ships fired many live rounds, concussion grenades, and flares at Palestinian fishing boats near the shore of Gaza city, forcing them to leave. The navy fired a barrage of live fire at the boats and many flares while the Palestinians were fishing in Palestinian waters not far from the shore, northwest of Gaza city. The navy also fired concussion grenades and ordered the fishermen to leave in addition to threatening to abduct them and confiscate their boats. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- Several Israeli army jeeps invaded Beit Liqya village, west of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, leading to protests before the soldiers shot three Palestinians, including a child, and abducted a young man. The soldiers invaded the village before storming and ransacking an auto parts store and abducted its owner Ayed Anwar Mafarja. The soldiers fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at the Palestinians and surrounding property. The soldiers shot three Palestinians

with the rubber-coated steel bullets, including a child who was shot in his eye. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)

- Israeli forces seized an agricultural tractor working in the northern Jordan Valley lands. Israeli forces raided the area and seized a tractor belonging to a Palestinian resident while he was working on plowing agricultural lands in the northern Jordan Valley area. The Israeli occupation confiscated eleven tractors during the past two years. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- Five Palestinian young men were injured last night after the Israeli occupation forces (IOF) stormed different areas of the West Bank, clashed with local youths and kidnaped a number of citizens from their homes. Four young men suffered bullet injuries, one seriously, during violent clashes with the IOF in al-Deheisha refugee camp near Bethlehem. The IOF intensively fired live ammunition and stun and tear gas grenades at the young men, who responded by throwing stones, empty bottles and Molotov cocktails. The IOA also kidnaped two young men from the camp after raiding some homes and detonating their gates and doors. (PALINFO 24 March 2022)
- A Young man was seriously injured in his chest after the Israeli Occupation Forces (IOF) opened fire at local youths in al-Ma'ajen neighborhood in Nablus City. The IOF raided several homes and interrogated local residents during its campaign in the same neighborhood. (PALINFO 24 March 2022)
- Israeli occupation forces (IOF) opened fire at Palestinian agricultural lands, east of Khan Yunis. Israeli soldiers stationed at a military watchtower opened fire towards agricultural lands east of the town of Khuza'a town. Two similar attacks were also reported east of Al-Fukhari and Abasan Al-Kabirah towns. (PALINFO 24 March 2022)
- Israeli police forces also carried out a raid and search campaign in al-Tur town in Occupied Jerusalem. (PALINFO 24 March 2022)
- Three Palestinians, including a child, were shot and injured by Israeli gunfire as clashes erupted in Beit Laqia town, southwest of Ramallah. The clashes broke out when IOF soldiers stormed the town and arrested a local man from his workplace. A child was shot and injured in his eye. However, the IOF prevented ambulances' access to the town to transfer the injured for treatment. (PALINFO 24 March 2022)
- Israeli navy targeted Palestinian fishermen sailing offshore, west of Gaza city. The fishermen were sailing within three nautical miles offshore the

area when Israeli naval boats opened heavy gunfire, concussion grenades and flare bombs toward them, forcing the fishermen to flee for their safety. Meanwhile, heavily-armed soldiers stationed along Gaza's eastern frontier, east of Khan Younes, opened heavy gunfire towards farmers as the latter were tending to their land, east of Abasan al-Kabira city and Khuza'a town, forcing them to flee for their safety. Israeli Settler Violence

- Illegal Israeli colonizers burnt several sections of a mosque in Jama'in village, south of Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, in addition to puncturing tires of many cars near Jerusalem. The colonizers infiltrated the village and went to the local mosque before using flammable materials to burn its main entrance. The colonizers also burnt carpets in the mosque before the Palestinians managed to extinguish the fire. The colonizers also wrote racist anti-Palestinian and anti-Arab graffiti on the walls of a home near the mosque. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- The colonizers partially burnt a mosque and a clinic in addition to puncturing the tires of 21 Palestinian cars in Mikhmas village, northeast of occupied Jerusalem. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- Hordes of Jewish settlers escorted by police forces desecrated the Aqsa Mosque in Occupied Jerusalem. At least 63 settlers entered the Mosque in different groups through its Maghariba Gate and toured its courtyards. During their tours at the Islamic holy site, the settlers received lectures from rabbis about the alleged temple mount and a number of them provocatively performed Talmudic prayers. (IMEMC 24 March 2022)
- Israeli settlers slashed tires of more than 20 Palestinian-owned cars in Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood in occupied East Jerusalem. Dozens of Israeli settlers broke into Sheikh Jarrah and vandalized around 20 cars parked in the area and owned by local Palestinian residents, including his family. (Wafa 24 March 2022)
- Israeli settlers torched parts of a mosque in Zeita Jamma'in village, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus. A group of settlers sneaked into the village, and throw a highly flammable substance at the entrance of the local mosque, setting the carpet on fire. The settlers, scrawled anti-Palestinian

and anti-Arab hate graffiti on the wall of a nearby house before they fled the scene. (WAFA 24 March 2022)

Home Demolition & Demolition threats

- The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) demolished two Palestinian homes in the north of Jericho City at the pretext of unlicensed construction. Israeli bulldozers escorted by soldiers demolished two makeshift homes belonging to two brothers in Arab al-Kaabna community near al-Auja village. The measure led to the displacement of 12 individuals, including children. (WAFA 24 March 2022)

Other

- The Israeli government is scheduled to approve the establishment of 10 Jewish-only towns in the Negev on 27 March 2022. The Israeli interior minister Ayelet Shaked declared that "five new towns will be created near Arad, in addition to the haredi (ultra-Orthodox) community of Kassif that was authorized last week. Five more will be created on the road between Beersheba and Dimona." (PALINFO 24 March 2022)
- The Israeli daily, Haaretz, revealed today that Israeli soldiers operating in the occupied territories have instructions to collect information on 50 Palestinian citizens every day until a database is established about all the Palestinian citizens in the occupied territories. "Soldiers posted in the West Bank have recently received instructions from their commanders that in any shift at a checkpoint or guard post they must enter the details and photos of at least 50 Palestinians to the IDF's (Israeli army) 'Blue Wolf' tracking system," it said. "A soldier who doesn't make the quota, they were told at the briefing, will not be relieved from duty at the end of their shift and will be forced to remain on duty until they make quota." Haaretz said the "Blue Wolf" system, a database into which the details and photos of Palestinians are uploaded enabling their tracking and monitoring, has been used by the Israeli army for the past two and a half years.
