Israeli Violations' Activities in the occupied State of Palestine

2 June 2022

The daily report highlights the violations behind Israeli home demolitions and demolition threats in the occupied Palestinian territory, the confiscation and razing of lands, the uprooting and destruction of fruit trees, the expansion of settlements and erection of outposts, the brutality of the Israeli Occupation Army, the Israeli settlers violence against Palestinian civilians and properties, the erection of checkpoints, the construction of the Israeli segregation wall and the issuance of military orders for the various Israeli purposes.

The Violations are based on reports provided by field workers and/or news sources.

The text is not quoted directly from the sources but is edited for clarity.

Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Israeli soldiers killed a young Palestinian man after the army invaded the Deheishe refugee camp, south of Bethlehem, in the occupied West Bank. Dozens of soldiers invaded the refugee camp from several directions before storming and ransacking many homes, leading to protests. The soldiers fired a barrage of live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs at the protesters and surrounding homes. An Israeli army sharpshooter occupying a rooftop of a Palestinian home killed a young man after shooting him with a live round in the heart. The slain young man was a former political prisoner and is identified as Ayman Mahmoud Mheisin, 29. The Palestinian was not participating in the protests and his killed while walking near his home when the soldiers shot him. The soldiers also shot another young man with a live round in the leg. The soldiers abducted two Palestinians, Issa Shadi Ma'ali, 20, and former political prisoner Abdullah Nayef Ramadan, 30, from their homes in the refugee camp. The soldiers invaded the Ma'ali family home to abduct Jad but could not find him and decided to abduct his brother, Issa, to pressure Jad into turning himself in to the army. The invasion was initially conducted by undercover forces driving a car with Palestinian license plates before many army jeeps invaded the refugee camp. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)
- Israeli soldiers killed a young Palestinian man and injured at least six, including three who suffered serious wounds, during protests that took place after many army jeeps invaded Ya'bad town, southwest of Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. At least thirty military vehicles, including armored bulldozers, invaded the town before the soldiers stormed homes and occupied their rooftops to use them as firing posts and started to demolish a home. Dozens of Palestinians protested the invasion and hurled stones at the soldiers who fired a barrage of live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs. The soldiers shot Bilal Awad Kabaha, 24, with live rounds in the chest and thigh. During the invasion, the army fired many gas bombs at homes and buildings, causing many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)

- Israeli soldiers abducted a Palestinian woman near the Ibrahim Mosque in Hebron city, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers stopped the woman Afnan Mohammad Idrees and her husband at one of the military roadblocks surrounding the mosque and abducted her. The soldiers cuffed and blindfolded the woman and took her to a police station near the mosque. The woman was interrogated for more than two hours before the army released her. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)
- Israeli soldiers injured three Palestinians with live fire and caused dozens to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation in the al- 'Arroub refugee camp, north of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. Several army vehicles invaded the refugee camp from several directions after surrounding and isolating it. The invasion led to protests before the soldiers fired many live rounds, including expanding bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. The army shot three Palestinians with the illegal expanding bullets and caused dozens to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)
- Israeli soldiers detained and interrogated a Palestinian child in the yard of her home in the Shallala Street, in the center of Hebron city, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. Many soldiers invaded and ransacked his home before abducting his daughter, Salwa, 12 years of age. The soldiers took his child to a military roadblock near Hebron Municipality while she was crying and screaming in fear as they dragged her away. The Israeli army claimed the child "was carrying a knife" in the yard of her home. The family denied the allegation, and the soldiers could not provide any evidence of the alleged knife before releasing the child. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)
- The Israeli occupation forces (IOF) attacked several Palestinian homes near the border fence in the north of the besieged Gaza Strip. The IOF fired machine guns and tear gas canisters at homes in an-Na'aima area in the east of Beit Hanoun town, north of Gaza. No one was reportedly hurt in the shooting attack. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)

Israeli Settler Violence

- Dozens of Jewish settlers desecrated the Aqsa Mosque in Occupied Jerusalem under tight police protection in the morning and later in the afternoon. At least 200 settlers entered the Mosque in different groups through its Maghariba Gate and toured its courtyards under police guard. During their tours at the Islamic holy site, the settlers received lectures from rabbis about the alleged temple mount and a number of them provocatively performed Talmudic prayers. Meanwhile, the Israeli occupation police imposed movement restrictions on Muslim worshipers at the Aqsa Mosque's entrances and gates. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)

Home Demolition & Demolition threats

- After an invasion lasting for about twelve hours, Israeli soldiers detonated, a Palestinian home in Ya'bad town, southwest of the northern West Bank city of Jenin. More than thirty armored military vehicles invaded the town after surrounding and isolating it. The soldiers invaded and occupied the rooftops of many homes and deployed sharpshooters before Israeli Combat Engineering Corps personnel started wiring the family home of Dia' Hamarsha, 27. The soldiers forced the family out of the property and ordered all Palestinians in surrounding homes to leave the area, and demolished parts of Hamarsha's home before detonating it. The explosions also caused damage to a few surrounding homes before the army started firing live rounds at Palestinians who protested the attack. Protests also took place after the army demolished the home, and the soldiers fired many live rounds at the Palestinians before withdrawing from the town. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)
- The Israeli municipal authorities in Occupied Jerusalem notified a Palestinian building in Silwan town with demolition under the pretext of being built without permit. The demolition order will leave more than 100 Palestinians homeless, including women, children, and elderly. The four-story building, containing 12 flats, was built in 2014. The residential facility is home to dozens of Jerusalemite families who were displaced more than once after their houses were razed to make way for settlement expansion. One of the residents, Iyad Abu Sobeih, stated that About two years ago, the occupation demolished his house and he was obliged to rent an apartment in this building. But a few days ago, they were surprised by the Israeli evacuation order in preparation for its demolition under the pretext of being built without permit. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)

- The Israeli occupation authority (IOA) demolished a residential room and a water well belonging to a farmer in al-Baqa'a area in the northeast of Hebron. The same farmer received a demolition notice against an agricultural structure in the area. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)
- The Israeli occupation army (IOA) stormed Khirbet al-Fakhit hamlet in Masafer Yatta, south of al-Khalil, and demolished nine agricultural and residential structures for the fourth consecutive time in four months. The Israeli army displaced a large number of Palestinian citizens, including women and children, after wreaking havoc on their tents in Khirbet al-Fakhit. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)
- In Salfit, the Israeli occupation army (IOA) delivered 10 stop-work orders against homes and structures in Marda village at the pretext they are located in Area C, which is under Israeli military control. There are families living in six of these homes received stop-work orders. The houses were built legally in 1995 and are located in Area B, which is under Palestinian civil control and Israeli military control. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)
- The Israeli occupation army (IOA) demolished a mobile home that housed a family of five individuals and a cattle shed in az-Za'ayem town, northeast of Jerusalem. Four walls belonging to local residents were also knocked down during the same demolition campaign in az-Za'ayem town. (PALINFO 2 June 2022)

Israeli Closures

- The Israeli army continued the closure of Beita junction, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, for the seventh day, inflicting hardships on more than 15,000 Palestinians, including farmers, merchants, and students. The closure of this main junction affects the lives of at least 15,000 Palestinians, especially since it obstructs the transfer of fruits and vegetables to the central market in the town. The market is essential because it is a distribution hub of fruits and vegetables to markets in the northern and central parts of the occupied West Bank, an issue that is causing serious losses to the farmers. The closure also obstructs the movement of students, workers, and employees as the junction leads to many surrounding areas and governorates. (IMEMC 2 June 2022)
